STARRED QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Division of Assets and Liabilities between the States of Punjab and Haryana

***5. Shri Fateh Chand Vij :** Will the Chief Minister be pleased to state-

(a) Whether it is a fact that the State of Haryana has not been given its due share of the movable and of the

immovable property on the formation of this State on 1st
November, 1966;

(b) Whether the State Government has made any complaint in this connection to the Government of India or to the Committee entrusted with the work of dividing the assets and liabilities ; if so, full details in respect of each department together with the date on which the complaint was made in each case ;

(c) Whether the Government of India or the said Committee has taken any decision on the said complaints so far; if so, full details thereof, if no decision has been taken so far, the steps beings taken by the State Government in this connection ?

Shrimati Om Prabha Jain (Finance Minister) : A Statement is laid on the Table of the House.

STATEMENT.

(a) The division of movable and immovable property of the erstwhile state of the Punjab has been made in accordance with the provisions of the Punjab Reorganisation Act, 1966. Residuary power exist with the Government of India for the division of any assests and liabilities not covered by the provisions of the Act. The Central Government has also powers to make re-allocations of assests and liabilities in accordance with section 65 of the Act. The provisions in sections 63 and 65 of the Punjab Reorganisation Act are as follows-

“63. The benefit or burden of any assests or liabilities of the existing State of Punjab not dealt with in the foregoing provisions of this Part shall pass to the State of Punjab in the first instance, subject to such financial adjustment as may be agreed upon between all the successor States before the 1st day of November, 1967, or in default of such agreement, as the Central Government may by order direct.

65. Where, by virtue of any of the provisions of this Part, any of the successor States becomes entitled to any property or obtains any benefits or becomes subject to any liability, and the Central Government is of opinion, on a reference made within a period of three years from the appointed day by any State that it is just and equitable that the property or those benefits should be transferred to or shared with, one or more of the other successor States, or that a contribution towards that liability should be made by one or more of the other successor States, the said property or benefits shall be allocated in such manner or the other successor State or States shall make to the State primarily subject to the liability such contribution in respect thereof, as the Central Government may, after consultation with State Governments concerned by order determine.”

(b) The question of making any reference to the Committee for the division of assests and liabilities does not arise because the Committee ceased to exist after the re-organisation of the erstwhile Punjab. Representations have, however, been made to the Government of India on a number of issues. The important ones among them are as follows:-

(1) Properties outside the territory of the erstwhile States of Punjab, (rest houses and other properties in Delhi and elsewhere) vest in new Punjab according to the Reorganisation Act but due share in them must be given to Haryana. (Reference made to the Government of India on 28th December, 1966.)

(2) Western Jamuna Canal System and Drainage Works lying in Delhi. Punjab is claiming this Property according to the provisions of the Reorganisation Act but it must vest in Haryana Government Reference made to the Government of India on 28th December, 1966)

(3) Division of Chandigarh Printing Press and its allied wings, stocks and stores. (This is with the Chandigarh Administration and the Haryana Government has represented that it should be divided.) (Reference made to the Government of India on 15th December, 1966.)

(4) Allocation of machinery in the Irrigation Wing such as draglines. etc. used on the drainage side. (Reference made to the Government of India on 6th February, 1967.)

(5) Division of stocks of evacuee and other confiscated firearms lying with the Firearm Bureau, Phillaur (Reference made to the Government of India on 22nd December, 1966).

(6) Distribution of transport vehicles. (Representation for securing a proper share of transport vehicles of various makes such as Mercedes, Leylands etc.) (Reference made to the Government of India on 22nd December, 1966).

(7) Distribution of the Ayurvedic store of the Central Government Pharmacy, Patiala. (Reference made to the Government of India on 22nd March, 1967.)

It will not be in public interest to give full details in respect of each of the items.

(c) The decision of the Government of India on the above issues is yet awaited. The State Government is vigorously pursuing the matter.

“..... It will not be in the public interest to give full details in respect of each item referred to the Government of India. I trust you will agree with this view so that these details are not disclosed to the detriment of the interest of the State.”

CONSTRUCTION OF METALLED ROADS IN

*6 Shri Fateh Chand Vij : Will the Minister for Public Works be pleased to state :-

(a) the total mileage of metalled roads scheduled to be constructed during the Third Five Year Plan in district Karnal together with the names thereof and the details of the schemes under which the said roads were to be constructed;

(b) the names of the roads referred to in part (a) above which have been completed so far or are being constructed as present;

(c) Whether the roads out of these mentioned in part (a) above; on which the construction work has not been started so far, have been given preference in the Fourth Five Year Plan; if not, the reasons therefore ;

(d) Whether Rajakheri – Bebel road in tehsil Panipat district Karnal is also included in the category of roads referred to in part (c) above ?

Chaudhri Rizaq Ram : (a) 142 miles; the names of the roads and the details are given in column 2 of the statement placed on the Table of the House.

(b) Road completed-

(1) Panipat Assand Kaithal Patiala Road.

(2) Ambala Pehowa Kaithal Narwana Road.

(3) Bye pass at Radaur.

(4) Pehowa Gulha T. Road.

(5) Kutail to G. T. Road.

(6) Assand S. Iwan Road.

Roads under construction:-

(1) Rajond Pundri Pehowa Patiala Road.

(2) Amabala Pehowa Kaithal Narwana Road.

(3) Bye pass at Radaur.

(4) Pehowa Gulha T. Road
