SUMMONING AND SITTINGS OF THE VIDHAN SABHA

The Haryana Vidhan Sabha was summoned to meet, after the fourth General Elections, for its 1ST Session in the Hall of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha. Vidhan Bhawan, Sector-1, Chandigarh, on the 17th March, 1967, by an order of the Governor, dated the 3rd March, 1967, and it continued to meet till the 30th March, 1967, when it was adjourned sine-die.

The Sabha was reconvened to meet on the 5th June, 1967 by the Speaker, under the second proviso to Rule 16 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Punjab Legislative Assembly and it continued to meet till the 21st June, 1967, when it was again adjourned sine-die. It was prorogued by an order of the Governor, dated the 27 June, 1967.

During the Session, the Sabha held twenty two sittings.

Governor's Address

The Governor addressed members of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha on Monday, the 20th March, 1967 at 10.00 A.M.

The Deputy Speaker laid a copy of the Governor's Address before the Sabha on the 21st March, 1967.

The motion of thanks on the Address was moved by Sh. Mangal Singh and seconded by Sh. Dalip Singh on the 5th June, 1967.

The motion was discussed on:-

The 5th June, 1967 - For 179 minutes (Treasury 88 minutes and opposition 91 minutes).

The 6th June, 1967 - For 159 minutes (Treasury 113 minutes and Opposition 46 minutes)

Eighteen members took part in the discussion, nine each from the Treasury and the Opposition Benches, speaking for 3 hours and 21 minutes and 2 hours and 17 minutes, respectively. The total time taken by the Treasury and Opposition Benches comes to 5 hours and 38 minutes.

The motion was carried on the 6th June, 1967, without any division. It was communicated by the Speaker to the Governor the same day.

FINANCIAL BUSINESS

I. Financial Statement for the period from 1st November, 1966 to 31st March, 1967:-

I. The Financial statement showing the receipts and disbursements for the period from 1st November, 1966 to 31st March, 1967 for validation of expenditure authorised by the Governor under section 42 of the Punjab Reorganisation Act, 1966, was presented to the Sabha on the 21st March, 1967 and discussed and voted upon on the 27th March, 1967.

There were 55 Demands in all, totalling a sum of Rs. 88,59,02,970. In consultation with the House, a general discussion was permitted on all the Demands for Grants together. All the Demands for Grants were put together to the vote of the House and carried. Five members from the Treasury and three Members from the opposition Benches took part in the discussion, speaking for 40 minutes and 10 minutes respectively. The Finance Minister, by way of reply, spoke for 13 minutes.

II. The Haryana Appropriation Bill, 1967

The Haryana Appropriation Bill, 1967 (Bill No. 2-HLA of 1967) in respect of the Financial Statement for the period from 1st November, 1966 to 31st March, 1967, was introduced on the 30th March, 1967 (1st sitting).

It was before the Sabha for 21 minutes. Two Members from the Opposition took part in the discussion speaking for 18 minutes. The Bill was passed.

II. The Vote-on-Account, 1967-68 (for three months from 1st April, 1967 to 30th June, 1967).

(i) The Vote-on-Account, 1967-68 (for three months from 1st April, 1967 to 30th June, 1967), was presented to the Sabha on the 28th March, 1967 and discussed and voted upon on the 29th March, 1967.

There were 52 Demands in all, totalling a sum of Rs. 29,39,41,205.

In consultation with House, a general discussion was permitted on all the Demands for Grants on Account together. All the Demands for Grants on Account were carried after guillotine. Five members from the Treasury Benches including the Finance Minister and four members from the Opposition participated in the debate speaking for 82 minutes and 54 minutes respectively. The Finance Minister, by way of reply spoke for 17 minutes.

(ii) The Haryana Appropriation (Vote-on-Account) Bill, 1967.

The Haryana Appropriation (Vote-on-Account) Bill, 1967 (Bill No. 3-HLA of 1967) in respect of the Vote-on-

Account (for three members from 1st April to 30th June, 1967) was introduced on the 30th March, 1967 (2nd sitting).

It was before the Sabha for 12 minutes.

Only one members from the Opposition spoke on the Bill for six minutes.

The Bill was passed.

III. Budget Estimate for the Year 1967-68

The Budget Estimate for the Year 1967-68 were presented to the House by the Finance Minister on the 28th March, 1967.

On the 9th June, 1967, the Finance Minister presented the Memorandum explanatory to the Budget Estimates for the year 1967-68,

1. General Discussion – The General discussion on the Budget was held on the:-

13 th June, 1967	For 227 minutes	Treasury 63 minutes and Opposition 164 minutes.
14 th June, 1967	For 247 Minutes	Treasury 121 minutes an Opposition 126 Minutes.
16 th June, 1967	For 170 minutes	Treasury 125 minutes and Opposition 45 minutes.

The total time taken by the Treasury Benches was five hours and nine minutes and by the Opposition five hours and thirty five minutes. The total number of Members who participated

was 37 (17 from the Treasury Benches and 20 from the Opposition).

2. Demands – There were in all 52 Demands from Grants totalling a sum of R. 1,73,53,37,640.

Demands Nos. 9, 22, 44, 16, 26, 27, 28, 45 and 46 were specifically discussed.

(a) The Demand No. 9 was discussed singly.

(b) The following Demands were discussed together but voted upon separately:-

The Haryana Appropriation (No. 2) Bill 1967.

The Haryana Appropriation (No. 2) Bill, 1967 (Bill No. 13-HLA of 1967) in respect of the Demands voted by the Sabha was introduced on the 21st June, 1967 (2nd sitting).

It was before the House for 29 minutes, 5 members from the Treasury Benches speaking for 26 minutes. The Bill was passed.

LEGISLATION

The Sabha transacted Legislative Business on:

30th March, 1967 (1st and 2nd sittings).

Synopsis of Bills passed by the Haryana Vidhan Sabha during its (March-June) Session, 1967.

1. The Haryana Appropriation Bill, 1967.

(Introduced on 30th March, 1967 (1st sitting), passed on 30th March, 1967 (1st sitting).

This Bill authorises payment and appropriation of certain sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of

Haryana for the services of a part of the financial year, 1966-67, commencing on the first day of November, 1966 and ending on the thirty first day of March, 1967.

2. The Haryana Appropriation (Vote on Account) Bill, 1967.

(Introduced on 30th March, 1967 (2nd sitting), passed on 30th March, 1967 (2nd sitting)).

This Bill provides for the appropriation from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Haryana, of sums required to meet the grants made by the Vidhan Sabha and expenditure charged on the Consolidate Fund of the State of Haryana for the part of the financial year 1967-68.

3. The Punjab Excise (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1967.

(Introduced on 6th June, 1967 passed on 6th June, 1967).

This Bill a mends the principal Act, so as to empower Government to fix the maximum price above which intoxicants shall not be sold or supplied.

4. The Land Acquisition (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1967.

(Introduced on 6th June, 1967; passed on 6th June, 1967).

This Bill a mends the principal Act, so as to increase the rate of interest from four per cent to six per cent on compensation payable for land acquired by the Government.

5. The Punjab Land Revenue (Haryana Amendment and Validation) Bill, 1967.

(Introduced on 7th June, 1967; passed on 7th June, 1967).

This Bill amends the principal Act so as to facilitate the recovery of relief loans advanced to persons who were uprooted due to the Indo Pakistan hostilities or any other unlawful act during the anti-Punjabi Suba agitations as arrears of land revenues.

6. The Pepsu Tenancy and Agricultural Lands (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1967.

(Introduced on 7th June, 1967; passed on 7th June, 1967).

This Bill amends the principal Act, so as to remove the doubts that the exemption specified in section 51(1) (d) of the Pepsu Tenancy and Agricultural Land Act 1955, applied to lands granted for gallantry to any member of the Armed Forces.

7. The Punjab SECURITY OF Land Tenures (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1967.

(Introduced on 7th June, 1967; passed on 7th June, 1967).

This Bill amends the principal Act, so as to remove the doubts that the exemption specified in section 19-D of the Punjab Security of Land Tenures Act, 1953, applied to lands granted for gallantry to any members of the Armed Forces.

8. The Punjab Passengers and Goods Taxation (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1967.

(Introduced on 7th June, 1967 passed on 7th June, 1967).

This bill amends the principal Act, so as to authorise the officers of the Excise and Taxation Department to impose Penalties on the defaulters.

9. The Punjab Gram Panchayat (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1967.

(Introduced on 15th June, 1967; passed on 15th June, 1967).

This bill amends the principal act so as to remove the bar against the Legislators from becoming members of Gram Panchayats.

10. The Punjab Panchayat Samities and Zila Parishads (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1967.

(Introduced on 15th June, 1967; passed on 15th June, 1967).

This Bill amends the principal Act so as to remove the bar against Legislation form becoming members of the Panchayat Samities and Zila Parishads.

11. The Haryana Appropriation (No. 2) Bill, 1967.

(Introduced on 21st June, 1967 (2nd sitting); passed on 21st June, 1967 (2nd sitting)).

This Bill Provides for the appropriation from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Haryana of the sums required to meet the Grants voted by the Vidhan Sabha and the expenditure charged on the Consolidated Fund of the State of Haryana for the financial year, 1967-68.

This resolution could not be taken up on 23rd March, 1967 in view of the motion moved by the Minister for Parliamentary Affairs on 22nd March, 1967 and carried in the House that Rule 30 of the rules of procedure and conduct of Business is suspended and Government Business be transacted on Thursday, the 23rd March, 1967.

Note II:- Resolutions balloted for the 15th June, 1967, could not be taken up in view of the decision of the House taken on 13th June, 1967 while agreeing to the recommendations of the Business Advisory Committee to transact government business on this day.

RESOLUTIONS

(Moved)

1. On Thursday, the 8th June, 1967, Shri Ram Lal Chaudhri, M.L.A. moved that:-

“This House recommends to the government to take immediate steps to secure without further investigation or reference to arbitration or commission”-

- (i) inclusion of the entire territory of Kharar Tehsil Including Chandigarh town in Haryana as recommended by the shah commission;
- (ii) inclusion in Haryana of Fazilka Sub-Division, Nalagarh Tehsil and Dera Bassi and Lalru Police station areas of rajpura Tehsil on the basis of the Shah commission report which accepted the former two as Hindi Speaking areas and admitted the economy of the latter area to be intimately linked with Ambala;

(iii) exclusive control of the Bhakra project for Haryana which is The principal beneficiary and whose very life depends upon the efficient and proper administration of the project.

The house further recommends that all other boundary disputes and claims and counter claims as between Haryana and Punjab and Haryana and Himachal be got referred to and decided by a Judicial Commission.”.

The resolution was discussed by the House for 217 minutes.

Seven members from the opposition and nine members from the Treasury Benches, including the mover, the Minister for Transport and minister for development, took part in the discussion and spoke for 58 minutes and 147 minutes (the minister for Transport for 16 minutes and the minister for development for 23 minutes), respectively.

In addition to the above the Chief Minister, by way of reply, spoke for 12 minutes.

The amendments given notice of by Sarvshri Rizaq Ram and Dal Singh M.L.As. were deemed to have been read and moved.

Following amendment given notice of by Shri Dal Singh M.L.A. to the resolution was put and carried:-

Between parts (ii)&(iii) the following part (iii) be inserted and for existing ‘(iii),’ ‘(iv)’ be substituted.

“(iii) inclusion in district Jind of those 26 Vill.s of Sunam Sub-Tehsil which were part of Narwana Block and where the mother tongue of the inhabitants is Hindi.”

Ch. Rizaq Ram withdrew his amendment with the leave of the House.

The Resolution as amended was put and carried unanimously.

On Thursday, the 15th June, 1967, Ch. Rizaq Ram moved his resolution that:-

“This House recommends to the State Government to take necessary steps to make suitable amendment in the Hindu Succession Act, 1956 (Act No. XXX of 1956) in its application to the state of Haryana, so as to:-

- (a) Exclude from inheritance daughters and their children, grand daughters and their children, sisters and their children and brother's daughters, in the presence of male lineal descendants connected with the last male holder in the 5th degree of ascent descending from a common great great grand father.
- (b) Exclude from inheritance, father's sister, mother's father, mother's mother and mother's brother.
- (c) Treat the female holder in the matter of alienations by her, as limited owner on the lines of male holder under the Punjab Customary Law.
- (d) Place brother's sons, and brother's widow in the category of heirs along with brothers in schedule II of the Act.

The resolution was discussed for 68 minutes. Five members from the Treasury Benches including the Finance Minister, Development Minister and Chief Minister and four

Members from the Opposition participated in the debate for
37 and 31 minutes, respectively.

The Resolution was then withdrawn by the Mover
with the leave of the House.

Point of order and decision thereon

Whether the Assembly could pass a resolution on a subject that fell within the jurisdiction of the Central Government?

It was ruled that there was no bar on the House to pass a resolution recommending to the State Government to take steps to get the recommendation of the House implemented and that it was for the Government to see as to what action was required to be taken in the matter.

(On 15th June, 1967) Ch. Rizaq Ram moved a resolution in the House recommending to the State Government that steps be taken to amend the Hindu Succession Act, 1956 (Act No. XXX of 1956), Smt. Om Prabha Jain objected to its being moved on the ground that State Government was not competent to do so an that matter related to a Central Subjet. Thereupon the Speaker gave the above ruling.)
