(c) Whether there is any shortage building in any of the Primary School referred to in part (b) above, if so, the extent thereof and the period since when shortage is being experienced; and

(d) The steps, if any, taken or proposed to be taken now to remove the shortage, if any, of buildings in all the Schools referred top in part (a) above?

Education Minister (Sh. Maru Singh) Malik):

(a) According to the article 182 of the Education Code, School Building are not approved by the Department unless the class room so designed as to allow a floor area of at least nine square feet for each pupil in a Primary Class, and twelve square feet for each pupil in a Secondary Class, and unless the ventilation lighting and sanitary arrangements are satisfactory, the locality healthy, the neighborhood respectable and play grounds are provided.

(b) The time and labour involved in obtaining reply will not be commensurate to the benefit likely to be obtained.

(c) A statement is enclosed.

(d) Steps are being taken to meet the shortage of rooms in Government Primary Schools in Rohtak district out of the Government grants, District Building Common Pool Funds and Special Grant by Government for construction of sheds under the head “Improvement of Physical facilities.”

Beas-Sutlej Link Project

***749. Lala Balwant Rai Tayal:** Will the Minister for Irrigation and Power be pleased to state-

(a) The date on which the work on the Beas Sutlej Link Project was taken in hand together with the period within the work on the said project is likely to be completed;

(b) The Total cost of the said project as estimated in the beginning and as estimated at present, separately;

(c) The Total number of Engineer, belonging to Haryana as are working on the said project;

(d) Whether the Chief Minister, made any promise to the said deputation of Engineers which met him during his visit to the project last year;

(e) if so, details thereof and Whether the asid promise has been fulfilleds; if not, the reasons therefor;

(f) Whether there is any difference between the salaries of the Engineers and other Employees of Haryana Working on the project and the Engineers and other employees of Punjab, if so, details thereof and the reasons thereof;

(g) The details of the facilities, if any, being provided by the Haryana Government to the employees working in the said the Project; and

(h) Whether any particular categories of Engineer and other Offices get opportunity to work on the said project; if so, details thereof?

Irrigation and Power Minister (Sh. Ram Dhari Gaur):

(a) Work on Beas Sutlej Link Project was taken in 1960-1961. Present Schedule envisages of water in 12/73 and Commissioning of first Unit of Power Plant in 3/74.

(b) Original cost of sanctioned project estimate was Rs. 96.67 crores. Likely revised cost is Rs. 180 crores.

(c) The total no. of Haryana Engineer posted on the Beas Project is 200 as indicated below:-

(i)	Chief Engineer	1
(ii)	Supertending Engineers	6

(d) The Chief Minister, Haryana visited the Beas Project on 22nd and 23rd December, 1968. A deputation of

Employees Officers met the Chief Minister, who heard them and assured them that their demands would be considered sympathetically.

(e) The Government have sanctioned two advance increments to Officials/Officers working on the Beas Project subject to the following conditions:-

(i) The benefit of advance will be available to all technical and engineering staff.

(ii) The technical and engineering staff working in the field for the three years will get two advance increments, but the staff working on other job at Nangal, Sunder Nagar and Talwara should get one increment instead of two for three years service. These additional increments should be allowed up to two if this technical and engineering staff works for 6 years.

(iii) For the grant of advance increments, stay at the Beas Project should be at least 3 years subject to satisfactory work and the period of three years subject to satisfactory work and the period for the three years should be counted from 1st November, 1966.

(iv) The advance increments after the completion of three years will be granted from the date of increment. If completion of three years and normal date of increment is the same, the advance increment shall be granted from his normal date of increment.

(v) Technical and other engineering staff includes Engineer s Sectional Officers, Draftsman and Head Draftsman.

(vi) Yes. The information as available with this office with regard to difference of pay scales of Punjab and Haryana Engineers is given as under:-

Irrigation and Power Minister (Sh. Ram Dhari Gaur):

STATEMENT

(b) The information is being collected. As far as information is available, the applications have been received from almost all the villages in the State and process of providing electric connections is in hand. Villagers are finding difficulty in obtaining services Contractors for internal wiring and this is causing delay at some places. As soon as detailed information village-wise is received, detailed reply will be sent.

(c) Detailed information of expenditure incurred on rural electrification is not available. The expenditure is now being complied and will be available after March supplementary accounts are finalized. The number of villages electrified during 1970 was 4266 (1st January), 1970 to 31st December, 1970).

(d) The capital cost is not recoverable.

Percentages of Scheduled castes and Scheduled Tribes in Government Service

***1224. Ch. Banwari Lal:** Will the Minister for Development be pleased to state-

(a) The percentages of representation of scheduled castes and scheduled tribes in Govt. service fixed by the state Govt.;

(b) The percentage person belonging to Scheduled castes and Scheduled tribes actually employed in each class of service as on 30th June, 1971. and;

(c) The reason for short fall in the percentage referred to in part (a) above, if any ?

Development minister (Subedar Parbhu Singh):

(a) (i) In fresh and direct recruitment 20 per cent reservation has been made for these classes in all State services.

(ii) In the case of Class III and IV appointments to which there is no direct recruitment there will be 20 per cent reservation of vacancies in promotions made by (i) selection or (ii) on the results of competitive examinations limited to departmental candidates.

(b)

(c) (i) There is no reservation in promotion made on the basis of seniority-cum-fitness. Most of the posts of class II and III are filled by this method.

(ii) Suitable candidates belonging to these classes are not available, particularly for Technical Posts.

(iii) Reservation for these classes was made in 1949 for the first time. There was a shortfall from the very beginning but the same is gradually coming down.
