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SUMMONING, SITTING AND PROPAGATION OF THE HARAYANA VIDHAN SABHA

The Third Haryana Vidhan Sabha was dissolved by an order of the Governor under Article 174(2) (b) of the constitution on the 21st January, 1972 (forenoon). The Fourth Vidhan Sabha was constituted on the 14th March, 1972, by notification No. 308/HN/72, issued by the Election Commission of India under Section 73 of the Representative of the People Act, 1951.

The Fourth Haryana Vidhan Sabha was summoned to meet for its last session in the Hall of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha, Vidhan Bhawan, Chandigarh, on the 3rd April, 1972, and continued to meet till the 7th April, 1972, when it was adjourned sine-die., dated the 20th July, 1972.

During the Session, the Sabha held 4 sittings excluding the one when the Governor addressed the Members of Haryana Vidhan Sabha.

GOVERNOR'S ADDRESS

The Governor addressed the members of the Vidhan Sabha on the Tuesday, the 4th April, 1972, at 3.30 P.M.

The speaker reported the fact and laid a copy of the Governor's Address before the Sabha on the 5th April, 1972.

The motion of thanks on the Address was moved by Sh. Ram Saran Chand Mittal on the 5th April, 1972, and it was seconded by Ch. Sarup Singh.

The motion was discussed on-

the 5th April, 1972 for 226 minutes (Treasury 71 minutes and Opposition 155 minutes)

the 6th April, 1972 for 296 minutes (Treasury 154 minutes and Opposition 141 minutes)

Twenty three Members took part in the discussion, 13 from Treasury and 10 from the Opposition Benches speaking for 225 minutes and 296 minutes, respectively.

One amendment, from the Opposition Benches, Was moved to the motion. The amendment was put and lost and the motion of thanks was carried on the 6th April, 1972.

It was communicated by the Speaker to the Governor the same day, whose acknowledgement was read out to the House on the 7th April, 1972.

References to the deaths of the late King Mahendra of Nepal; Sh. Durga Dass Bhatia; Sh. B.M. Gupta; Dr. A.N. Jha, Lt. Governor, Delhi; Sh M. Henry Sameul, member of Rajya Sabha; Sh. N. Gopala Menon, former Speaker of the composite Madras Assembly; Sh. Mohan Lal, Ex-M.L.C.; Pt. Amir Chand Bombwal' Sh. K.T. 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**SYNOPSIS OF BILLS PASSED BY THE HARYANA VIDHAN
SABHA DURING THE APRIL SESSION, 1972.**

1. The Punjab Land Revenue (Haryana Amendment Bill, 1972. (Introduced and passed on the 7th April, 1972)

This Bill seeks to amend the parent Act so as to treat loan advanced by the State Government to the Scholars, under the National Loan Scholarship Scheme, as State dues so that these could be recovered as arrears of Land Revenue.

2. The Punjab Homeopathic Practitioner (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1972. (Introduced and passed on the 7th April, 1972)

This Bill enables the Haryana Homeopathic Council to register Homeopaths, for a period of 8 years instead of six months so that registration of Homeopaths may undertaken up to 25th June, 1973.

3. The Punjab Ayurvedic and Unanni (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1972. (Introduced and passed on the 7th April, 1972)

This Bill seeks to amend the Parent Act to extend the period of registration of persons, practicing the Ayurvedic or Unani System of Medicines, from 24th September, 1971 to 30th June, 1972.

4. The Punjab Industrial Establishments (National and Festival Holidays and Casual and sick leave) Haryana Amendment Bill, 1972. (Introduced and passed on the 7th April, 1972)

This Bill seeks to amend the Parent Act to Provide for a worker to enjoy five Festival Holidays instead of such four holidays during each Calendar Year.

RESOLUTIONS

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (1) of Articles 252 of the constitution of India, this Assembly hereby resolves that the protection of wild animals and birds and all the matters connected therewith or ancillary and incidental thereto should be regulated in the State of Haryana by Parliament by law”.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by clause (1) of Article 252 of the constitution of India, this Assembly hereby resolves that the protection of wild animals and birds and all the matters connected therewith or ancillary and incidental thereto should be regulated in the State of Haryana by Parliament by law”.
