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**SUMMONING, SITTING AND PROPAGATION OF THE  
HARYANA VIDHAN SABHA**

The Haryana Vidhan Sabha was summoned to meet for its Third Session in the Hall of the Haryana Vidhan Bhawan, Chandigarh, on the 5th March, 1973 by an order of the Governor, dated the 17th February, 1973, and continued to meet till the 6th April, 1973, when it was adjourned sine-die.

The Sabha was reconvened to meet on the 25th June, 1973, by the Speaker, under second provision to Rule 16 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of business in the Haryana Legislative Assembly and it continued to meet till the 26th June, 1973, when it was again adjourned sine-die. It was later prorogued by an order of the Governor, dated the 28th June, 1973.

During the Session, the Sabha held 26 sittings as may be seen from the programme observed, excluding the one relating to Governor's Address to the Assembly. The Sabha held two sittings (morning and Evening) on the 13th and 14th March, 1973.

**2. That the function of the Committee shall be-**

(i) to consider the reports submitted by the Commissioner for Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes under Articles 338(2) of the Constitution, in so far as they relate to the State of the Haryana and to report of the House as to the measure that should be taken by

the State government in respect of matter within the purview of the State Government;

(ii) to report to the House on the action taken by the State Government on the measures proposed by the Committee;

(iii) to examine measure taken by the State Government to secure due representation of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in Services and post under its control (including appointments in the Public Sector undertaking and statutory and Semi-Government bodies) having regard to the provision of Articles 335);

(iv) to consider generally and to report to the House on all matters concerning the welfare of the Scheduled castes and Scheduled Tribes which fall within the purview of the State Government;

(v) to examine such of the matters as may seem fit to the Committee or are specifically referred to it by the House or the speaker.



3. That the term of the Office of the Committee shall be one year.

4. In order to constitute a sitting of the Committee quorum shall be three.

5. That in all other respects the Rules of the Procedures of the Legislative Assembly relating to Committees of the Assembly shall apply with such variations and modification as the Speaker may make.”

## **2. Official Resolutions-**

(i) “Whereas, it is expedient to provide by law for the advertisements of the hazards involved in smoking cigarettes, with view to warn the smokers of cigarettes that the smoking thereof is dangerous to health and may cause death from cancer, coronary heart diseases, chronic bronchitis, pulmonary emphysema and other diseases, and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto;

And whereas, legislation for the purpose mentioned above in

relatable to matters enumerated in entry 6 of List II in the Seventh Schedule to the Constitution of India, with respect to which parliament has no power to make a law for the State except as provided in Articles 249 and 250 thereof;

And whereas, this is a matter of the almost importance and the problem is common to all the States, it would be desirable and necessary that there should be uniformity in the administration of any measure in this respect in all the States, It thus appear to this Assembly to be expedient in such a law should be enacted by Parliament;

NOW, THEREFORE, in pursuance of clause(1) of article 252 of the Constitution of India, this Assembly hereby resolves that Parliament should enact a law providing for advertisement of the hazards involved in smoking cigarettes and for matter connected therewith or incidental thereto;

## **FINANCIAL BUSINESS**

### **1. Supplementary Estimates (second Installment) 1972-73**

(i) Supplementary Estimates (second Installment) 1972-73, were made presented to the Sabha on the 8th March, 1973 and discussed and voted upon on the 12th March, 1973.

There were 27 demands in all, totaling a sum of Rs. 18,88,99,465.

As desired by the House, a general discussion was permitted on the Supplementary Estimates.

Six members from the Opposition and five from the Treasury Benches including the Revenue Minister, Home Minister and Finance Minister participated in the debate speaking for 75 minutes and 33 minutes, respectively.

(ii) The Haryana Appropriation Bill, 1973.- The Haryana Appropriation Bill, 1973 (Bill No. 12-HLA of 1973) in respect of the Supplementary demands granted by the Sabha on 12th March, 1973, was introduced on the 13th March, 1973 (Morning Sitting).

It was before the Sabha for 5 minutes. The Bill was passed without any discussion.

### **2. Budget**

**The Budget Estimates for the year 1973-74 were presented  
by the Finance Minister on the 9th March, 1973.**

(i) General Discussion.

General discussion on the Budget took place on the 14th March (Evening Sitting), the 16th and 20th March, 1973 for 270 minutes (Treasury 185 minutes and Opposition 85 minutes), 158 minutes (Opposition only) and 227 minutes (Treasury 145 minutes and Opposition 82 minutes), respectively. The Total time taken by Treasury Benches, including the Finance Minister, was 330 minutes and by Opposition 325 minutes. The total number of members, who participated were 22 (123 from the Treasury Benches and 9 from the Opposition).

(ii) Demands for grants

There were in all 50 Demands for the Grants totaling a sum of rs. 2,80,12,07,535.

All the demands were deemed to have been read and moved in the House on the 26th March, 1973. The Speaker permitted the discussion on all the Demands for grants and requested the Members to indicate the number of Demands on which a member wish to raise discussion

The demands were discussed-

Fourteen members took part in the discussion, 9 from Treasury and 5 from the Opposition Benches, speaking for 222 minutes and 135 minutes, respectively.

The Demands (1 to 50) were put to the vote of the House on the 27th March, 1973 and carried.

### **The Haryana Appropriation (No. 2) Bill, 1973**

The Haryana Appropriation (No. 2) Bill, 1973 (Bill, No. 13-HLA of 1973) in respect of the demands voted by the Sabha on the 27th March, 1973, was introduced on the 28th March, 1973.

It was before the Sabha for 153 minutes, Seven members from the Treasury benches (including the Revenue Minister, Home minister and Chief Minister) as well as the Finance minister in moving the motion and four from the Opposition, participated in the debate speaking for 93 minutes and 60 minutes, respectively.

The Bill was passed.

## **LEGISLATION**

The Sabha considered Legislative Business on the 13th March, 1973 (Morning Sitting), 28th, 30th March, 1973, 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 6th April, 1973, 25th and 26th June 1973. The Sabha Passed 37 Bills including two Appropriation Bills in respect of the Supplementary Estimates (Second Installment) for the year 1972-73, and the Budget Estimates for the Year 1973-74 (See Table).

**SYNOPSIS OF BILL PASSED BY HARYANA VIDHAN SABHA  
VIDHAN SABHA DURING THE BUDGET SESSION, 1973**

**1. The Haryana appropriation Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 13th March, 1973 and passed on the 13th March, 1973)**

The Bill authorizes payment and appropriation of certain further sums and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of the Haryana for the service of the financial year ending on the thirty-first day of March, 1973.

**2. The Haryana appropriation (No. 2) Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 28th March, 1973 and passed on the 28th March, 1973)**

The Bill authorizes payment and appropriation of certain sums from out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of the Haryana for the service of the financial year ending on the thirty-first day of March, 1973.

**3. The Punjab Motor Vehicles Taxation (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 30th March, 1973 and passed on the 30th March, 1973)**

The Bill replaces the ordinance which was promulgated to amend the principal Act, with a view to raising the maximum limit of tax of rupees ten thousand per vehicle per year to thirty-five thousand rupees per vehicle per year. The measure also withdraws the exemption given to the motor vehicle used for the purpose of Agriculture in order to augment the resources of the State.

**4. The Haryana Official Language (Amendment) Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 30th March, 1973 and passed on the 30th March, 1973)**

The Bill replaces the ordinance which was promulgated to the effects that the Bills in English Language to be introduced in the Vidhan Sabha or amendments thereto be moved in the House, shall, from the Budget session, 1973, be accompanied by a translation in Hindi, and authorized by the State Government.

**5. The Punjab Passengers and Goods Taxation (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 30th March, 1973 and passed on the 30th March, 1973)**

The Bill seeks to amend the Principal Act with a view to bringing parity between the Public and Private Carriers regarding the levy imposed on all fares and freight in respect of Public and private carriers and it also enhance the present rate of tax up to 60 percent.

**6. The Patiala State-Ijlas-Khas Order of 1919 (Haryana Repeal) Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 2nd, 1973 and passed on the 2nd, 1973)**

The Bills seeks to repeal the Patiala Ijlas-I-Khas Order 776 of 1919, with a view to abolishing the royalty on brick-kiln owners in erstwhile Patiala State and in Jind and Mahendergarh Districts of the erstwhile State of Pepsu with effect from 1st November, 1966.



**7. The Haryana Ceiling on land Holdings (Amendment) Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 2nd, 1973 and passed on the 2nd, 1973)**

This Bill seeks to amend the principal Act in the light of the observations of the ministry of home Affairs, Government of India, with regard to the section 3(j) and 5(a) and 32 of the Principal Act. The measure proposes that the term "orchard" as defined in the Principal Act should exclude Banana and guava tress also. The Act should also not apply to land holdings at any Cantonment Board and that the withdrawal of exemption regarding utilization of surplus area under - orchards, tea-estates or well-run farms under the Punjab law, should be from the "appointment day" and not from the "commencement of the Act".

**8. The Haryana Housing Board (Amendment) Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 2nd, 1973 and passed on the 2nd, 1973)**

This Bill seeks to amend the principal Act to remove certain difficulties in matters such as holdings of meetings, quorum statutorily requiring and signing and making of contracts etc. It also expands the definition of 'Premises' so as to 'include 'land' within its ambit. It further provide further for the removal of members, if any, of them is rendered unfit or becomes incapable of acting.

**9. The Punjab Town Improvement (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 2nd, 1973 and passed on the 2nd, 1973)**

This Bill seeks to amend the principal Act with regard to the constitution of Trusts, recruitment and control over their personnel, formulation and execution of trust scheme etc. with a view to enabling the Improvement Trust to play a more dynamic role in urban reconstruction and development.

**10. The Haryana Urban (Control of Rent and Eviction) Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 2nd, 1973 and passed on the 2nd, 1973)**

This Bill seeks to control the increase of rent of certain building and rented land situated within the limits of urban areas and the eviction of tenants there from

**11. The Indian Forest (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 2nd, 1973 and passed on the 2nd, 1973)**

This Bill seeks to amend the principal Act, in its application to the state of Haryana, enabling the State Government to recover all moneys. Other than fines payable to the state Government under the Principal Act and under any Rule made there under, as if it were an arrear of land revenue.

**12. The Punjab New Mandi Township (Development and Regulation) (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 2nd, 1973 and passed on the 2nd, 1973)**

This Bill seeks to amend the principal act in order to overcome the lacunae pointed out by the Supreme Court in its decision in Civil Appeal No. 1099 of 12967. The Supreme Court has held section 9 of the Capital of Punjab (Development and Regulation) Act, 1952, which provided for the resumption of plots for breach of conditions of transfer, to be violative of Articles 14 and Articles 19(1) (f) of the Constitution of India. Provision similar to it exists in the principal Act. This measure also amends certain provision of similar Act to overcome difficulties in the administration of the Act.

**13. The Punjab Urban Estate (Development and Regulation) (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 2nd, 1973 and passed on the 2nd, 1973)**

This Bill seeks to amend the principal Act in the light of the judgment delivered in the Civil Appeal No. 1099 of 1976 by the Supreme Court. It also makes provision to extend amenities provided in an urban estate to any other site of building situated in its vicinity and recovery of development charges on this account.

**14. The Haryana Municipal Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 3rd, 1973 and passed on the 3rd, 1973)**

This Bill seeks to consolidate and amend the law relating to municipalities in the state of Haryana.

**15. The Punjab State Legislative (Prevention of Disqualification) Haryana amendment Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 3rd, 1973 and passed on the 3rd, 1973)**

This Bill seeks to amend the principal Act, by declaring the offices of Chairman, vice-chairman, Deputy Chairman and members of the Haryana State Planning Board, the Khadi and Village Industries Board Haryana, the Harijan Kalyan Nigam, Haryana, the State Social welfare Advisory Boards, Haryana, not offices of profit for a member of the Haryana state legislature.

**16. The East Punjab War Awards Haryana amendment Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 3rd, 1973 and passed on the 3rd, 1973)**

This Bill seeks to extend the benefit envisaged in the principal Act to those parent who only son, only two sons and three or more than three children have served/still serving in the Indian Armed Forces during the emergency declared by the president of India on the 3rd December, 1971.

**17. The Punjab Resumption of Jagirs Haryana amendment Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 3rd, 1973 and passed on the 3rd, 1973)**

This Bill seeks to resume all military jagirs granted before the 4th August, 1914.

**18. The Haryana Restriction on (Development and Regulation of (Colonies Amendment Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 3rd, 1973 and passed on the 3rd, 1973)**

This Bill seeks to exclude from the definition of the colony the land which is sub-divided as a result of family partition, inheritance or succession etc. It also empowers the Government to exempt such classes of person in whose cases the application of provision of Principal Act is neither not considered expedient or causes undue hardship.

**19. The Haryana Land Holdings Tax Bill, 1973. (Discussion continued on the 4th April, 1973. (Introduced on the 4th, 1973 and passed on the 4th, 1973)**

This Bill seeks to provide for te levy and collection of tax on land holdings.

**20. The Punjab Gram Panchayat Haryana amendment Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 4th April, 1973 and passed on the 4th April, 1973)**

The Bill seeks to amend the principal Act so that a person who is unauthorized possession of Shamlat Deh is disqualified from contesting elections to Panchayat. It also seeks to substitute the words "District Board" by "Pamchayat Samiti in section 20,26,31,35 and98 of the principal Act. It

also authorizes the Government to appoint administrator to manage Panchayat property. It further provides for taking action against a Sarpanch or a Panch for misconduct. It further provide to suspend or supersede a Panchayat if it fails to provide proper sanitation, does not collect taxes and property manage Shamlat Deh. It also provide to increase the period of liability of a Panch for the loss caused to the Panchayat on his account from 4 years to 6 years from the occurrence of the los etc., and from one year to two years from his ceasing to be member, whichever is less.

**21. The Punjab Agricultural Produce Markets Haryana amendment Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 4th April, 1973 and passed on the 4th April, 1973)**

This Bill seeks to amend the principal Act to strengthen the Haryana State Agricultural Marketing board and the Market Committee in order to make them more effective. It also empowers the duty commissioner/Sub-divisional Officer (Civil) in inspect the Market Committees of the State.

**22. The Haryana Agricultural Credit Operations and Miscellaneous (Banks) Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 4th April, 1973 and passed on the 4th April, 1973)**

This Bill seeks to make provision to facilitate adequate flow of credit for agricultural production and development through banks and other institutional credit agencies and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

**23. The Punjab Village Common Lands (regulation) (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 6th April, 1973 and passed on the 6th April, 1973)**

This Bill seeks to amend the principal Act with a view to ensuring proper management and better utilization of Shamlat Land vested in Panchayat. It also authorizes the Block Development and Panchayat Officers/Social Education and Panchayat Officers to move the Assistant Collectors 1st Grade for ejectment of illegal and unauthorized occupants of Shamlat lands.

**24. The Punjab Motor Vehicles Taxation (Haryana Second Amendment) Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 6th April, 1973 and passed on the 6th April, 1973)**

This Bill seeks to amend the principal Act with a view to giving relief in respect of motor vehicles of other States to extent that in case they enter Haryana territory for short period not exceeding 15 days, the token tax leviable on them would be 1/25th part of the annual tax.

**25. The Punjab Panchayat Samitis and Zila Parishad (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 6th April, 1973 and passed on the 6th April, 1973)**

This Bill Seeks to:-

(i) amend section 5 of the Principal Act to provide that reconstituted Panchayat Samiti for a re-delimited Tehsil or

block shall consist of Members representing areas immediately before re-delimitation and subsequently included in the re-delimited Tehsil or Block and to empower the Government to fill the vacant seats, if any, in such cases by nomination.

(ii) Assign such portion of land holding tax not exceeding seven per centum of the total annual land holding tax realized within the area of Panchyat Samiti in lieu of the shares of local rate. For the purposes, section 63 of principal Act is being amended;

(iii) Abolish Zila Parishad in the state to empower Government to control and supervise the functioning of Panchayat Samitis with this object in view, chapter 6 of the principal Act is being omitted. Other changes in the principal Act are of ordinary Character.

**26. The Punjab Co-operative Land Mortgage Banks (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1973(Introduced on the 6th April, 1973 and passed on the 6th April, 1973)**

This Bill seeks to amend the principal act to change the name of Land Mortgage Bank to Land Development Bank' with a view to advancing long term loan for development of agricultural land. It also seeks to streamline the recovery under the Land Mortgage Bank Act.

**27. The Punjab Co-operative Societies (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 6th April, 1973 and passed on the 6th April, 1973)**



This Bill seeks to amend the principal Act with a view to recovering the loan from the Member of Milk Co-operative Societies as arrears of land revenue.

**28. The Haryana General Sales Tax Bill, 1973.  
(Introduced on the 6th April, 1973 and passed on the 6th April, 1973)**

This Bill Seeks to provide for and validate the levy of a tax on the sale or purchase of certain goods in the State of Haryana.

**29. The Punjab Urban Immovable Property Tax  
(Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 25th June, 1973 and passed on the 25th June 1973)**

This Bill seeks to extend the operations of valuation lists in some rating areas in the interest of State Revenue.

**30. The Punjab entertainment duty (Haryana  
Amendment) Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 25th June,  
1973 and passed on the 25th June 1973)**

The Bill seeks to remove the defect pointed out by the Punjab and Haryana high Court Writ No. 2084 of 1963. It also abolishes the additional duty which has been levied in aid of the Bangla Desh Refugees.

**31. The Punjab Excise (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 25th June, 1973 and passed on the 25th June 1973)**

The Bill seeks to amend the principal Act with a view to vesting the Financial commissioner with the Power of review of his orders and to give the power of appeal against the order of the Financial Commissioner to the Government, or to pass orders in revision regarding the legality or propriety of any order passed under the Punjab Excise Act, 1914.

**32. The Punjab Khadi and Village Industries Board (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 25th June, 1973 and passed on the 25th June 1973)**

This bill seeks to provide that the appointment of a Member of Parliament as Chairman of the Haryana Khadi and Village Industries Board should not incur a disqualification for the member. It also makes a provision that the Chairman if he is a Member of Parliament should not be paid any honorarium.

**33. The Indian Forest (Haryana Second Amendment) Bill, 1973. (Introduced on the 25th June, 1973 and passed on the 25th June 1973)**

This Bill seeks to enhance punishment for the forest offences so as to restrict the number of forest offences and for better preservation of forest produce.

**34. The Indian Stamp (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1973. . (Introduced on the 25th June, 1973 and passed on the 26th June 1973)**

This Bill seeks to amend the Principal Act in order to check various mal practices to evade stamp duty. It also withdraws the additional duty imposed the refugee relief from 1st April, 1973.

**35. The Registration (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1973. . (Introduced on the 26th June, 1973 and passed on the 26th June 1973)**

This Bill seeks to amend the principal Act and the Indian Registration Act to recover the consequential deficiency in registration fee.

**36. The Haryana Requisitioning and Acquisition of Immovable Property bill, 1973. . (Introduced on the 26th June, 1973 and passed on the 26th June 1973)**

This seeks to provide for the Requisitioning and Acquisition of Immovable Property for the purpose of the state.

**37. The Punjab Agricultural Produce market (Haryana Second**

**Amendment) Bill, 1973. . (Introduced on the 26th June, 1973 and passed on the 26th June 1973)**

This Bill seeks to give fair representation to dealers, producers and Panchayat Samitis on the Haryana State Agricultural Marketing Board.

## **RESOLUTION**

### **(i) Official**

(i) On the 30th March, 1973, State Minister for Home and Health Home moved-

(i) "Whereas, it is expedient to provide by law for the advertisements of the hazards involved in smoking cigarettes, with view to warn the smokers of cigarettes that the smoking thereof is dangerous to health and may cause death from cancer, coronary heart diseases, chronic bronchitis, pulmonary emphysema and other diseases, and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto;

And whereas, legislation for the purpose mentioned above in relatable to matters enumerated in entry 6 of List II in the Seventh Schedule to the Constitution of India, with respect to which parliament has no power to make a law for the State except as provided in Articles 249 and 250 thereof;

And whereas, this is a matter of the almost importance and the problem is common to all the States, it would be desirable and necessary that there should be uniformity in the administration of any measure in this respect in all the States, It thus appear to this Assembly to be expedient in such a law should be enacted by Parliament;

NOW, THEREFORE, in pursuance of clause(1) of article 252 of the Constitution of India, this Assembly hereby

resolves that Parliament should enact a law providing for advertisement of the hazards involved in smoking cigarettes and for matter connected therewith or incidental thereto;

Three members from the Opposition and one member from the Treasury Benches spoke for 4 minutes and one Minute respectively.

The resolution was put and carried.

(ii) On the 30th March, 1973, State Minister for Irrigation and Power moved-

“That this House approves, under sub-section (3) of section 65 of the Electricity (Supply) Act, 1948 (Central Act, 54 of 1948), the fixation by the State Government of a higher maximum amount of two hundred and fifty crores of rupees which the Haryana State Electricity Board may at any time have on Loan under sub-section (1) of that section.”

One Member from the Opposition and one member from the Treasury Benches spoke for 5 minutes and 3 Minute respectively.

The resolution was put and carried.

On the 4th April, 1973, State Minister for Home and Health Home moved-

“Whereas this Assembly considers that there should be uniform Legislation in the country to ban the setting up of

Sub-standard medical college by private organizations where the criterion for admission is not merit but the ability to pay huge sums of advance tuition fees and capitation donation and there is need to regulate the existing private medical colleges in such manner as is feasible and desirable;

AND WHEREAS, Legislation for the purpose mentioned above is relatable to matters enumerated in entry 11 of List II in the Seventh Schedule to the constitution of India, with respect to parliament has no power to make a law for States except as provided for in Articles 249 and 250 thereof;

AND WHEREAS, it appears to this Assembly to be desirable that the aforesaid matters should be regulated in the State of Haryana, by Parliament by law;

Now, therefore, in pursuance of clause (1) of Article 252 of Constitution of India, this Assembly hereby resolves that the imposition of ban on the setting up of Private medical colleges and the regulation of such existing colleges and all matters connected therewith or ancillary and incidental thereto should be regulated in the State of Haryana by Parliament by law.”

No member rose to speak. The resolution was put to the vote of the House and carried.

(iii) On the 25th June, 1973, the Chief Minister moved-

“That this House ratifies the amendments to the constitution of India falling within the purview of the provision

to clause (2) of article 368 thereof, proposed to be made by the Constitution (Thirty-First Amendment) Bill, 1973, as passed by the two Houses of Parliament.”

“That Sh. Bansi Lal, Chief Minister, Haryana, while replying to the debate on grant of demands on 27th March, 1973, has given ‘absolutely wrong statement’ in the House that there is no ‘Joint Commissioner’ in the State of Haryana. In fact, there is Joint Commissioner in Labour Department of Haryana State. This statement of the Chief Minister on the floor of the House amounts to breach of Privilege under the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Haryana Legislative Assembly and be referred to the Privilege Committee.”

The Speaker ruled that मैं इस संबंध में “The Law of Parliamentary Privileges of India by V.G. Ramachandran” के पेज 189 की और माननीय सदस्य का ध्यान आकर्षित करता हूँ:—

“(9) Alleged incorrect Statement made by a Minister. The ruling was that if a member believes that the Minister’s statement is untrue, incomplete or incorrect, no question of

privilege arises. The remedy lies in the member writing to the Speaker about it. The Speaker will then call the Minister to give his statement. If the dispute is not thereby resolved, both will be placed on the record of the House. No further enquiry can be made in the matter.

इस स्थिति को सम्मुख रखते हुए मैं इस मर्यादा के प्रश्न उठाने की स्वीकृति प्रदान नहीं कर सकता, परन्तु मुख्य मंत्री महोदय से प्रार्थना करूंगा कि वह इस स्थिति को स्पष्ट कर दें।

## POINTS OF ORDERS AND DECISION THEREON

सदन में गुप्स मैबर्ज के लिए सीटें किस आधार पर अलाट की गईं ?

श्री अध्यक्ष ने निम्नलिखित निर्णय दिया:—

‘अभी चौधरी हरद्वारी लाल जी ने जो प्वायंट रेज किया, वह रूल 4 के बारे में है इस रूल में यह लिखा हुआ है:—

“The Members shall sit in such order as the Speaker after consultation with the leader of the House and leaders of the Parties may appoint.

जब हमने हाउस समन किया, उसके कुछ दिन बाद हमने हरेक पार्टी लीडर को एक चिट्ठी लिखी और चार्ट भेजा कि वे लिखकर भेजें कि वे किस प्रकार से अपने सदस्यों को सदन में बिठाना चाहते हैं लेकिन मुझे खेद है कि किसी भी पार्टी लीडर का जवाब मुझे कल तक नहीं मिला। हाउस शुरू होने से पहले तक, सिर्फ जनसंघ दल के नेता चौधरी शिव राम वर्मा, मुझे मिले थे, लिखकर उन्होंने भी कुछ नहीं भेजा। मैंने उनकी इच्छा की कदर करते हुए, जैसी उन्होंने इच्छा प्रकट की, उसी प्रकार से सीटें अलाट करने की कोशिश की है। इसके अलावा कोई ऐसा रूल, कोई ऐसा कायदा नहीं है कि कहां किसको बिठाया जाये। मैंने लीडर आफ दी हाउस, पार्लियामेंटरी अफेयर्स के जो इन्चार्ज

मिनिस्टर हैं और पार्टी लीडर की कन्सलटेशन से ये सीटें अलाट की हैं और जो सीटें अलाट की हैं, वे बिल्कुल ठीक की है।

मैं बता देता हूं। मैंने लीडर आफ दी पार्टीज से, लीडर आफ दी हाउस से ओर पार्लियामेंटरी अफेयर्स के जो मिनिस्टर इन्चार्ज हैं, उनसे कन्सल्ट किया है। जैसे कि अभी मैंने आपके सामने बतलाया, मैंने प्रत्येक पार्टी के लीडर को लिखा, लेकिन न वे सलाह करने के लिए आए और न ही उन्होंने अपने सुझाव लिखकर भेजे।

(दिनांक 6 मार्च, 1973 को चौधरी हरद्वारी लाल द्वारा उठाए गए औचित्य प्रश्न का ऊपर अध्यक्ष महोदय ने उपर्युक्त निर्णय दिया)।

**2. क्या कोई मैनबर कोई सप्लीमेंट्रीया कोई सवाल गवर्नमेंट की पालिसी के मुताल्लिक पूछ सकता है ?**

श्री अध्यक्ष ने निर्णय दिया कि 'गवर्नमेंट की पालिसी के सम्बन्ध में कोई भी प्रश्न नहीं पूछा जा सकता है। अगर हमारे पास भी कोई ऐसा मूल प्रश्न आता है तो हम उसको रिजैक्ट कर देते हैं।

(दिनांक 8 मार्च, 1973 को मुख्यमंत्री, चौधरी बंसी लाल, द्वारा उठाए औचित्य प्रश्न के ऊपर अध्यक्ष महोदय ने उपर्युक्त निर्णय दिया)।

3. क्या बोलने वाले आनरेबल मँबर और चेयर के बीच में से कोई आदमी गुजर सकता है ?

The Deputy Speaker ruled, "No. That is wrong."

(दिनांक 8 मार्च, 1973 को श्री अमर सिंह द्वारा उठाए गए औचित्य प्रश्न का ऊपर अध्यक्ष महोदय ने उपर्युक्त निर्णय दिया)।

**4. Whether a member can indulge in general discussion while speaking on a particular demand?**

The Deputy Speaker ruled that she had already told the Hon'ble Member that he cannot speak on general. If he does so again, I will not allow him to speak.

(On the point of order raised by Ch. Mehar Chand on 12-3-1973, the Deputy Speaker gave the above ruling.)

**5. Whether discussion on Governor's Address could be continued when there was no Ministe in the House?**

The Chairman ruled that there was need for their presece. They should be present : at least one of them.

(This point was raised by Sh. Amar Singh on 14<sup>th</sup> March, 1973 (Morning sitting) when discussion on Governor's Address was contining but no Minister was present in the House. On this, the Chairman gave the above ruling.)

**6. Whether the copy of a personal letter could be placed on the Table of the House?**

The Deputy Speaker ruled: “ You cannot place.”

(On 26<sup>th</sup> March, 1973, Sh. Amar Singh, during the course of his speech, wanted to place a copy of the letter addressed by him to the Prime Minister of India, regarding raising of any socially backward group through education on the table of the House. Sh. Gulab Singh Jain raised this point of order and the Deputy Speaker gave the above ruling.)

**7. Whether the Punjab Motor Vehicles Taxation (Haryana Amendment) Ordinance, (Haryana Ordinance No. 1 of 1973) and the Bill in respect thereof were valid?**

The Speaker ruled that the Bill was in order and if the Hon. member wanted to question its validity, he could do so in a court of law.

(On the 30<sup>th</sup> March, 1973 when the Transport Minister introduced the Punjab Motor Vehicles Taxation (Haryana Amendment) Bill 1973, Ch. Ram Lal Wadhwa raised a point of order on which the Speaker gave the above ruling.)

**8. Whether any member could cite a book during the course of his speech on the floor of the House?**

The Deputy Speaker ruled that he could not do so as it had nothing to do with the Bills before the House.

(On 3-4-1973, when Ch. Ram Lal Wadhwa, during the course of his speech on the Punjab State Legislature (Prevention of Disqualification) Haryana Amendment Bill, wanted to cite a portion concerning theory of Democracy from a Book, the Chief Minister raised this point of order and the Deputy Speaker gave the above ruling.)

9. क्या ए सदस्य जिसका मोशन किसी मजमून पर डिसकशन के लिए सब से पहले पहुंचा हो उसे उस रैजोल्यूशन को मूव करने से रोका जा सकता है ?

श्री अध्यक्ष ने इस प्रकार निर्णय दिया:—

‘ये रूलज 78, 79 इसमें एप्लाइ नहीं होते ।

आज गवर्नमेंट डे है इसलिए कोई भी गैर—सरकारी काम लीडर आफ दी हाउस की इच्छा पर रखा जा सकता है । रूल नम्बर 29 आप पढ़ लें । तो जैसी उन्होंने इच्छा प्रकट की है उसके मुताबिक हमने इन्कलूड कर दिया है ।

इसके लिए ऐसा प्रोविजन है और जैसा कि मैंने पहले अर्ज किया है कि सरकारी दिन में गैर—सरकारी काम करना लीडर आफ दी हाउस की इच्छा पर निर्भर करता है । अगर चार मोशनज आती हैं तो वे लीडर आफ दी हाउस के सामने रख देते हैं और जिनको वे ऐक्सैप्ट करना चाहें करते हैं । इसके अलावा बिजनैस ऐडवाइजरी कमेटी के अन्दर सारा बिजनैस सामने रख दिया जाता है और जिस आर्डर से वह उसे रखती है उसके अनुसार रिपोर्ट हाउस के सामने पेश की जाती है, जिसे हाउस मन्जूरी देता है । तो जिस तरह से बिजनैस ऐडवाइजरी कमेटी ने यह सारा प्रोग्राम



तय किया है और जिस तरह हाउस ने उसे मन्जूर किया है उसके अनुसार बिजनैस कंडक्ट हो रही है।

यह बिजनैस ऐडवाइजरी कमेटी की रिपोर्ट है जैसे-जैसे, जो जो मोशन उन्होंने अपनी रिपोर्ट में इन्कलूड की है उसे हाउस मन्जूर कर चुका है और जो चीज हाउस मन्जूर कर चुका है उसके बारे में कोई चर्चा नहीं हो सकती है।

कोई बात रूल्ज के अगेंस्ट नहीं हुई है। जिस बात के बारे में सदन पहले निर्णय ले चुका है उस पर आप चर्चा नहीं कर सकते क्योंकि वह सदन का निर्णय है।

(दिनांक 4 अप्रैल, 1973 को श्री राम लाल वधवा, जिन्होंने हरियाणा कृषि-उद्योग निगम लि० के वर्ष 1970-71 के चतुर्थ वार्षिक प्रतिवेदन तथा लेखों पर चर्चा के लिए सबसे पहले नोटिस दिया था और जो चाहते थे कि वे ही मोशन मूव करं, के औचित्य प्रश्न पर अध्यक्ष महोदय ने उपरोक्त निर्णय दिया।)

(ii) to report to the House on the action taken by the state Government or the measures proposed by the Committee;

(iii) to examine the measures taken by the state Government to secure due representation of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in service and post under its

control (including appointment in the public sector undertaking and statutory and Semi-Government bodies) having regard to the provisions of Article 335;

(iv) to consider generally and to report to the House on all matters concerning the welfare of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes which fall within the purview of the state Government

(v) to examine such of the matters as may seem fit to the Committee or are specially referred to it by the House or the Speaker.

3. The the term of office to the Committee shall be one year.

4. In order to constitute a sitting of the Committee the quorum shall be three.

5. That in all other respects the Rules of Procedure of the Legislative Assembly relating to Committees of the Assembly shall apply with such variations and modifications as the Speaker may make.”

NOW, THEREFORE, in pursuance of clause(1) of article 252 of the Constitution of India, this Assembly hereby

resolves that Parliament should enact a law providing for advertisement of the hazards involved in smoking cigarettes and for matter connected therewith or incidental thereto”.

The motion was put and carried.

The Bill was then considered Clause by Clause.

Clauses, 2,, 1, the Enacting Formulas and the Title were, put one by one, and carried.

The Agriculture Minister moved-

“That the Bill be passed”

The motion was put and carried.
