It was later prorogued by an order of the Governor, dated the 10th December, 1974.

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FINANCIAL BUSINESS

Supplementary Estimates (Second Installment) 1974-75.

- (i) Supplementary Estimates (Second Installment) 1974-75 were presented to the Sabha on the 27th November, 1974 and discussed and voted on the 22nd December, 1974.

There were two demands in all totaling a sum of Rs. 6,80,00,000.

All the demands were deemed to have been read and moved and the members were requested to indicate the demands numbers on which they issued to raise discussion while speaking.

All the demands were carried. Five Members from the Opposition and eight from the Treasury Benches (including the Transport Minister) participated in the debate speaking for 40 and 75 minutes, respectively.

- (ii) The Haryana Appropriation (No. 5) Bill, 1974:-

The Haryana Appropriation (No. 5) Bill, 1974 (Bill No. 49 HLA of 1974) in respect of the Supplementary Demands granted by the Sabha on the 22nd December, 1974 was introduced on the 3rd December, 1974.

It was before the Sabha for 51 minutes. Four Members from the Opposition and Five from the treasury Benches (including the Finance Minister) took part in the

discussion and spoke for 15 and 31 minutes respectively Five minute were taken for putting the motion in respect of this Bill.

The Bill was passed.

LEGISLATION

The Sabha considered legislative Business on the 26th, 27th November and 3rd December, 1974. The Sabha passed 16 Bills including one appropriation Bill in respect of the Supplementary Estimates (Second Installment) for the year 1974-75. all of them were passed without any amendment except three Bills, namely,- The Punjab Improvement (Haryana Second Amendment) Bill, 1974, the Punjab New Mandi Townships (Development and Regulation) Haryana Amendment Bill, 1974 and the Punjab Co-operative Societies (Haryana Second Amendment) Bill, 1974, in which certain amendments were made in the House. 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**SYNOPSIS OF THE BILLS PASSED BY VIDHAN SABHA
DURING THE EIGHT (NOVEMBER-DECEMBER) SESSION,
1974**

**1. The Haryana Contingency Fund (Amendment) Bill, 1974
(Introduced and passed on the 26th November, 1974).**

This Bill seeks to enhance the contingencies Fund of the state of Haryana from one Crore Rupees to three crore rupees as the former has been found to be inadequate.

2. The Punjab Homoeopathic Practitioner (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1974. (Introduced and passed on the 26th November, 1974).

This bill replaces the Ordinance which was promulgated to amend the Homeopathic Practitioner Act, 1965, with a view to extend the time limit for the registration of Homeopaths and to save the Homeopathic Council from financial loss.

3. The Haryana Public Wakfs (Extension of Limitation) Bill, 1974(Introduced and passed on the 26th November, 1974).

This Bill seeks to extend the period of limitation in certain cases for suits to recover possession of immovable property forming part of public wakfs.

4. The Punjab Town Improvement (Haryana Second Amendment) Bill, 1974. (Introduced and passed on the 26th November, 1974).

This Bill seeks to amend the principal Act with to enlarge the qualifications for appointments of the President of the Tribunal from a person who is qualified for appointment as a judge of the High Court of Punjab and Haryana to a person having experience as a Collector/District Magistrate. It also enables the President of the Tribunal to record the evidence on any matter in absence of assessors.

5. The Haryana Land Holding Tax (Second Amendment) Bill, 1974. (Introduced and passed on the 27th November, 1974).

The Bill replaces the Haryana Ordinance No. 5 of 1974 to provide for aggregation of holdings of the members of the family for the purposes of assessment of the tax and to classify the various assesses.

6. The Haryana Mechanical Vehicles (Bridge Tolls) Bill, 1974. (Introduced and passed on the 27th November, 1974).

This Bill seeks to provide for the levy and collection of tolls on mechanical vehicles crossing certain bridges in the State of Haryana.

7. The Punjab Land revenue (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1974. (Introduced and passed on the 27th November, 1974).

This Bill seeks to amend the Principal Act so as to empower the State Government to recover the arrears of loans or installments with interest and penal interest on the loans advanced by the State Government to:-

- (i) a student under the Haryana Engineering Education Loan Rules;
- (ii) a member of a scheduled Caste under the Rules for grant of loan for purchase of Evacuee land in bet and non-Bet areas or
- (iii) a person under the Rules for the grant of loans for repair of houses in urban areas; as arrears of land revenue

8. The Haryana essential Services Maintenance Bill, 1974. (Introduced and passed on the 27th November, 1974).

This Bill seeks to provide for the maintenance of essential services in the State of Haryana and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

9. The Haryana state Legislature (Prevention of Disqualification) Bill, 1974. (Introduced and passed on the 27th November, 1974).

This bill seeks to declare that certain offices of profit under the Government shall not disqualify the holders thereof for being elected as, or for being, members of the Legislature of the State of Haryana.

10. The Punjab Gram Panchayat (Haryana Third Amendment) Bill, 1974. (Introduced and passed on the 27th November, 1974).

The object of this bill is to remove the legal lacuna by amending section 103 of the Principal Act to provide that on the suspension of Gram Panchayat its Powers and duties (except judicial function), shall be exercised and performed by such persons as may be appointed by the State Government and its pending judicial cases shall be disposed of by the Chief Judicial Magistrate or the District Judge or the Collector, as the case may be, in accordance with the law. Section 105 of the Act is also being amended to empower Government to review the Act is also being amended to empower Government to review orders of the Deputy Director of Panchayats passed under this section.

11. The Punjab New Mandi Township (Development and Regulation) Haryana amendment) Bill, 1974. (Introduced and passed on the 27th November, 1974).

This Bill seeks to amend the Principal Act for enable the Government to make Rules for supply of water and provision of other amenities.

**12. The Haryana Housing Board (Amendment) Bill, 1974.
(Introduced and passed on the 27th November, 1974).**

This Bill seeks to amend the Principal Act for effecting recovery of dues and penalty realizable under the various provisions of the Act.

**13. The Haryana appropriation (No. 45) Bill, 1974.
(Introduced and passed on the 3rd December, 1974).**

This Bill seeks to authorize payment and appropriation of certain further sums and out of the consolidated Fund of the State of Haryana for the services of the State for the financial year ending on the thirty-first day of March, 1975

14. The Punjab Panchayat Samitis (Haryana Validation) Bill, 1974. (Introduced and passed on the 3rd December, 1974).

This Bill seeks to validate the Panchayat Samities already reconstituted for the re-delimited blocks and to regularize all acts and proceedings of such Panchayat Samities.

15. The Haryana Municipal Common Lands (Regulation) Amendment Bill, 1974. (Introduced and passed on the 3rd December, 1974).

This Bill seeks to cover the area under the Faridabad Complex Administration under the Haryana Municipal Common Land (Regulation) Act, 1974, so as to vest the Shamilat situated in the Faridabad Complex, in the Administration thereof.

16. The Punjab Co-operative Societies (Haryana Second Amendment) Bill, 1974. (Introduced and passed on the 3rd December, 1974).

It seeks to amend the Principal Act to make provision for the appointment of administrator for the administration of such societies pending the Constitution of a nominated committee. It further provides that a member shall be deemed to have served for the full term if he tenders resignation just before the expiry of six years.

It also seeks to repeal the Haryana Co-operative Sugar Mills (Constitution and Tenure of Committees) Act, 1971 and incorporate the provisions of the 1971 Act in the Punjab Co-operative Societies Act 1961.

RESOLUTIONS

Three members of the Opposition namely, Ch. Partap Singh Daulata, Ch. Dal Singh and Ch. Ram Lal Wadhwan, participated in the debate speaking for 6 minutes, 7 minutes and 13 minutes, respectively.

RESOLUTIONS

(Moved)

On Thursday, the 28th November, 1974 Shri Jagjit Singh Tikka, M.L.A. moved that:

“This House recommends to the State government to approach the Government of India to allocate adequate funds to the State of Haryana for increasing the power generation. In the life of present day world, power plays a great role in every sphere such as Agriculture, Industry, Health, Trades etc. Therefore, generation of power, to the extent that it can satisfy complete needs of all sectors is very necessary. Haryana State was progressing in Agriculture and Industry in an exemplary way but this year the shortage of power has brought down the production in Agriculture and Industry to a great extent which also effected the employment of labour. Therefore, adequate provision of funds for power generation is necessary and till Haryana State is ale to produce power to the full satisfaction of its Power need, the Government of India may allocate Power from other States so that the tempo of progress is not affected in Haryana.”

And spoke for 35 minutes.

The resolution was discussed on Thursday, the 28th November, 1974 and remained before the House for 134 minutes.

Four Members from the Treasury Benches including the mover, and five members from the Opposition Benches, participated in the debate for 90 minutes, respectively.

Irrigation and Power Minister spoke for 15 minutes by a way of reply and he was still on his legs when the House adjourned.

The discussion remained inconclusive.

Observation made by the Speaker (Ch. Sarup Singh) on the 2nd December, 1974, regarding conversion of Adjournment Motion into Call Attention Motion etc.

I have received three notices of motions one of Adjournment Motion, another of Call Attention Motion and the third of Privilege Motion. Adjournment Motion relates to the alleged assault on Sh. Jaya Prakash Narayan. I cannot admit this as an Adjournment Motion. But, however, I convert it into Call Attention Motion. The Government may reply to it tomorrow (Interruptions). About the Call Attention Motion and the Privilege Motion, I may inform the House that these are under my examination and I will decide them tomorrow.

RULING GIVEN BY THE SPEAKER/DEPUTY SPEAKER

In that case, it shall not be necessary to move for leave to introduce the Bill and if the Bill is afterwards introduced, it shall not be necessary to publish it again.

“This House recommends to the State government to approach the Government of India to allocate adequate funds to the State of Haryana for increasing the power generation. In the life of present day world, power plays a great role in every sphere such as Agriculture, Industry, Health, Trades etc. Therefore, generation of power, to the extent that it can satisfy complete needs of all sectors is very necessary. Haryana State was progressing in Agriculture and Industry in an exemplary way but this year the shortage of power has brought down the production in Agriculture and Industry to a great extent which also effected the employment of labour. Therefore, adequate provision of funds for power generation is necessary and till Haryana State is ale to produce power to the full satisfaction of its Power need, the Government of India may allocate Power from other States so that the tempo of progress is not affected in Haryana.”

Zealand headed by His Excellency Mr. S.A. Whitehead, Speaker of the House of representative, is watching's the proceedings of our House today (thumping).

His Excellency Mr. S.A. Whitehead, ranks third in his country in order of precedence following the Governor General and the Prime minister (thumping). He was a member of parliament since 1957.

I Welcome the distinguished Parliamentarians to this House and our State, and convey our peoples to the greetings to the people, Parliament and Government of New Zealand through their representatives. I may also add that besides the Hon'ble Speaker, the delegation consists of three members each from the Government and Oppositions sides, who are experts in the fields of banking, education, medicine and surgery, press reporting, accountancy, dairy and Sheep farming etc.

I hope the distinguished guests enjoyed their short stay here and will carry the happy memories of their visit to the capital of Haryana, one of the most beautiful and modern cities of India.

As the Hon. Members of this House are having their tea with the visiting delegation, the house will adjourn for half-an-hour at 11.30 and will again meet at 12 noon.
