**SUMMONING, SITTINGS AND PROROGATION OF

"WHEREAS this Assembly considers that in furtherance of the objectives set out in the National Forest Policy Resolution dated 12th May, 1952 of the Government of India, Ministry of Food and Agriculture, Department of Agriculture, Published in the Gazette of India dated 12th May, 1952, it is expedient to consolidate and amend the law relating to forests with a view to have a uniform law throughout India for the management and preservation of forests and forest wealth and for all matters connected therewith or ancilliary or incidental thereto;

AND WHEREAS the subject matter of such a law is relatable mainly to entry 19 (Forests), and incidentally to certain other entries, of List-II of the Seventh Schedule to the Constitution of India;

AND WHEREAS Parliament has no power to make

laws for the States with respect to the matters aforesaid except as provided in articles 249 and 250 of the Constitution of India;

AND WHEREAS it appears to this Assembly to be desirable that the aforesaid matters should be regulated in the State of Haryana, by Parliament by law;

NOW, THEREFORE, in the exercise of the powers conferred by clause (1) of article 252 of the Constitution of India, this Assembly hereby resolves that all matters falling under entry 19 of List-II-State List of the Seventh Schedule to the Constitution of India and all matters connected therewith or ancilliary or incidental thereto should be regulated in the State of Haryana, by Parliament, by law."

GOVERNOR'S ADDRESS

The Governor addressed the Vidhan Sabha on Monday, the 12th January, 1976 at 2.00 P.M.

The Speaker reported the fact and laid a copy of the Address before the Sabha at its meeting held on the 12th January, 1976 at 3.30 P.M.

The motion of Thanks on the Governor's Address was moved on the 13th January, 1976, by Shri Girish Chander Joshi and seconded by Shri Amar Singh.

This motion was discussed:—

On the 13th January, 1976 for 232 minutes (Treasury 186 and

Opposition 46 minutes).

On the 14th January, 1976 for 231 minutes (Treasury 172 and

Opposition 59 minutes).

Fifteen members took part in the discussion, twelve from the Treasury Benches including the Chief Minister and three from the Opposition Benches, speaking for 358 minutes and 105 minutes, respectively.

The motion of Thanks was carried on the 14th January, 1976. It was communicated by the Speaker to the Governor the same day, whose acknowledgement was read out to the House on the 15th January, 1976.

REFERENCES

Reference to the death of the late Shri Kumaraswamy Kamaraj, Former President of the Indian National Congress, was made on the 12th January, 1976, by the Leader of the House. Pt. Chiranji Lal Sharma, Revenue Minister, Smt. Lekhwati Jain, Deputy Speaker, Chaudhri Phool Chand (Mullana) & Shri K. N. Gulati spoke from the Treasury Benches, and Sarvshri Partap Singh Daulata, Shiv Ram Verma and Peer Chand, spoke from the Opposition Benches. The Speaker also associated himself with the sentiments expressed in the House. All the members stood in silence for two minutes, as a mark of respect to the memory of the deceased.

On the 19th January, 1976, a reference was also made to the sad demise of late Giani Gurmukh Singh Musafir, M. P., by the Leader of the House. Chaudhri Partap Singh Daulata, a member of the Opposition also spoke. The Speaker also associated himself with the sentiments expressed in the House. All the members stood in silence for two minutes and then the House adjourned for an hour as a mark of respect to the memory of the deceased, and re-assembled at 4.00 P.M . on that day .

FINANCIAL BUSINESS

1. Budget

The Budget Estimates for the year 1976-77 were presented by the Finance Minister on the 16th January, 1976.

(i) General Discussion

General discussion on the Budget took place on the 19th and 20th January, 1976 for 148 minutes (Treasury 44 minutes and Opposition 104 minutes) and 246 minutes (Treasury 210 minutes and Opposition 36 minutes), respectively. The total time taken by the Treasury Benches was 254 minutes and Opposition 140 minutes. The total number of members, who participated were 14 (10 from the Treasury Benches and 4 from the Opposition).

(ii) Demands for Grants

There were in all 25 Demands for Grants totalling a sum of Rs. 4,08,94,68,121.

All the demands were deemed to have been read and moved in the House on the 21st January, 1976. The Speaker permitted the discussion on all the Demands for Grants and requested the Members to indicate the number of Demands on which a Member wished to raise discussion.

The Demands were discussed on the 21st January, 1976 for 182 minutes (Treasury 136 minutes and Opposition 46 minutes).

Ten members took part in the discussion, seven from the Treasury Benches including the Revenue Minister and Finance

Minister and three from the Opposition Benches, speaking for 136 minutes and 46 minutes, respectively.

All the demands (1-25) were put one by one and carried.

The Haryana Appropriation Bill, 1976

The Haryana Appropriation Bill, 1976 (Bill No. 13—HLA of 1976) in respect of the demands Voted by the Sabha on the 21st January, 1976, was introduced on the 23rd January, 1976. The total sum to be authorised out of the Consolidated Fund of the State was Rs. 5,33,88,54,877.

It was before the Sabha for 115 minutes. Five Members from the Treasury Benches, including the Finance Minister, in moving the motion and the Chief Minister by way of reply, and two from the Opposition Benches participated in the debate speaking for 73 minutes and 42 minutes, respectively.

The Bill was passed.

(2) The Supplementary Estimates (Second Instalment) 1975-16

(i) The Supplementary Estimates (Second Instalment) 1975-76 **were** presented to the Sabha on the 19th January, 1976, and Voted on the 23rd January, 1976.

There were 19 demands in all totalling a sum of Rs. **31,50,06,539**. As desired by the House, a general discussion was permitted on the Supplementary Estimates .

One Member from the Opposition and four Members including the Finance Minister from the Treasury Benches spoke for 26 minutes and 21 minutes, respectively.

All the demands were put and carried.

(ii) The Haryana Appropriation (No. 2) Bill, 1976.

The Haryana Appropriation (No. 2) Bill, 1976 (Bill No. 14—HLA of 1976) in respect of Supplementary Estimates (Second Instalment) 1975-76, granted by the House on the 23rd January, 1976, was introduced on the 27th January, 1976.

(The total sum to be authorised out of the Consolidated Fund of the State was Rs. 41,31,20,129).

No Member rose to speak.

It remained before the House for 3 minutes The Bill was passed.

LEGISLATION

The Sabha considered Legislative Business on the 23rd, 27th and 28th January, 1976. The Sabha passed 19 Bills including two Appropriation Bills in respect of the Budget for the year 1976-77, and Supplementary Estimates (Second Instalment) for the year 1975-76 (see Table).

**SYNOPSIS OF THE BILLS PASSED BY THE HARYANA
VIDHAN**

SABHA DURING THE BUDGET SESSION, 1976.

(1) The Haryana Appropriation Bill, 1976. (Introduced on the 23rd January, 1976 and passed on the 23rd January, 1976).

This Bill seeks to authorise payment and appropriation of certain sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Haryana for the Services of the financial year ending on the thirty-first day of March, 1977.

(2) The Haryana Appropriation (No. 2) Bill, 1976. (Introduced on the 27th January, 1976 and passed on the 27th January, 1976).

This Bill seeks to authorise payment and appropriation of certain further sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Haryana for the services of the financial year ending on the thirty first day of March, 1976.

(3) The Punjab Betterment Charges and Acreage Rates (Haryana Repealing) Bill, 1976. (Introduced on the 27th January, 1976 and passed on the 27th January, 1976).

This Bill seeks to replace the Haryana Ordinance No. 5 of 1975, and Repeals the Punjab Betterment Charges and Acreage Rates, Act, 1952 in its application to the State of Haryana. It abolishes the betterment charges with effect from 1st day of July, 1975.

(4) The Punjab Urban Immovable Property Tax (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1976. (Introduced on the 27th January, 1976 and passed on the 27th January, 1976).

This Bill seeks to amend the Punjab Urban Immovable Property Tax Act, 1940, with a view to providing a rebate to assesses who deposit the property tax within time. Opportunity is also being taken to provide for the continued validity of valuation lists once prepared till they are substituted by new valuation lists.

(5) The Punjab Agricultural Produce Markets (Haryana Amendment and Validation) Bill, 1976. (Introduced on the 27th January, 1976 and passed on the 27th January, 1976).

This Bill seeks to replace the Haryana Ordinance No. 6 of 1975. It amends the Punjab Agricultural Produce Markets Act, 1961, and validates the levy, imposition, assessment or collection of fee on agricultural produce bought or sold or brought for processing in the notified market areas in the State of Haryana. It also seeks to define the term "Licensee" in section 2 of the Principal Act.

(6) The Punjab Co-operative Societies (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1976. (Introduced on the 27th January, 1976 and passed on the 27th January, 1976).

This Bill replaces the Haryana Ordinance No. 7 of 1975. It seeks to amend the Principal Act, by reducing the period from two months to fifteen days for the receipt of objections to the proposed amalgamation of Societies for the improvement of the working of the Societies and the flow of credit to the Members during this period.

(7) The Haryana Municipal (Amendment) Bill, 1976. (Introduced on the 27th January, 1976 and passed on the 27th January, 1976).

This Bill seeks to amend the principal Act, with a view to impose a unified tax on buildings and lands which is at present

being imposed under the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973 and Punjab Urban Immovable Property Tax Act, 1940.

(8) The Haryana General Sales Tax (Amendment) Bill, 1976. (Introduced on the 27th January, 1976 and passed on the 27th January, 1976).

This Bill seeks to amend the Principal Act, to overcome certain lacunae experienced in the working of the Act.

(9) The Haryana Ceiling on Land Holdings (Amendment) Bill, 1976. (Introduced on the 27th January, 1976 and passed on the 27th January, 1976).

This Bill seeks to amend the principal Act and to amend the definition of "family" in view of the decision of the Punjab and Haryana High Court taken in Civil Writ petition No. 4187 of 1973, entitled "Saroj Kumari and others Vs. the State of Haryana" decided on the 9th September, 1974.

This Bill also inter-alia provides for the vesting of the surplus area or tenants, permissible area already declared as such under the Punjab law and the area declared surplus under the Pepsu law, which has not so far vested in the State Government, in the State Government and for its immediate utilisation by the State for the purposes envisaged in those Acts, embodies an, exemption from the application of this Act to the lands owned by a Gurdwara, a temple, a Goshala, a waqf and other religious and charitable institutions subject to certain conditions and protects the interests of a minor and a person under a disability in the amount of compensation payable to him for acquisition of surplus area.

(10) The Punjab Panchayat Samitis (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1976. (Introduced on the 27th January, 1976

and passed on the 27th January, 1976).

This Bill seeks to make provision in the principal Act that :-

(a) a suspended Panch or Sarpanch, a member of a co-operative society or a member of a market committee, for the period of suspension shall be deemed to be suspended as a member of the Panchayat Samiti ; and

(b) the whole-time salaried servant of any co-operative society shall not be eligible for election as a member of a Panchayat Samitis

(11) The Punjab Shops and Commercial Establishments (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1976. (Introduced on the 27th January, 1976 and passed on the 27th January, 1976).

This Bill seeks to amend the principal Act with a view that no employee who has been in the service of the employer continuously for a period of three months shall terminate his employment unless he has given to his employer one month's previous notice or one month's pay in lieu thereof.

(12) The Punjab Town Improvement (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1976. (Introduced on the 27th January, 1976 and passed on the 27th January, 1976).

This Bill seeks to amend the principal Act by deleting sub-section 3 of Section 40 thereof, as it creates difficulty in the formulation of sanction o the development Schemes of an Improvement Trust.

It also authorises a Municipal Committee to pay a contribution annually to a trust constituted within its local area

for a specified period, at the initial stage for five years from the date of its constitution, to enable it to get over the initial financial difficulties. This will also save the Municipal Committee from payment of such contribution in perpetuity.

(13) The Haryana Urban (Control of Rent and Eviction) Amendment Bill, 1976. (Introduced on the 27th January, 1976 and passed on the 27th January, 1976).

This Bill seeks to amend the principal Act to amend the definition of "Non-residential building" and to provide for reasonable basis for the determination of the fair rent for the buildings which had been let on ridiculously low rent long before 1962 with a view to discouraging the evil of "Pagri" and providing reasonable safeguards and equitable treatment both to the tenants and landlords.

(14) The Punjab Excise (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1976. (Introduced on the 27th January, 1976 and passed on the 27th January, 1976).

This Bill seeks to amend the principal Act with a view to empowering the State Government to fix the price of intoxicants to be sold by distilleries and to overcome the effect of certain judicial pronouncements.

(15) The Punjab Gram Panchayat (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1976 (Introduced on the 27th January, 1976 and passed on the 27th January, 1976).

This Bill seeks to overcome some difficulties experienced in the effective and efficient working of the Panchayats. It inter-alia defines certain offices, empowers the Director of Panchayats to suspend any Panch/Sarpanch if he is involved in any criminal proceedings, to disqualify a Sarpanch if he

fails to attend two consecutive general meetings of the sabha, etc etc.

(16) The Haryana Relief of Agricultural Indebtedness Bill, 1976. (Introduced on the 28th January, 1976 and passed on the 28th January, 1976).

This Bill seeks to provide relief from indebtedness to Agricultural labourers, rural artisans, marginal farmers and small farmers.

(17) The Haryana Dowry Prohibition Bill, 1976. (Introduced on the 28th January, 1976 and passed on the 28th January, 1976).

This Bill seeks to provide for the prohibition of giving or taking of dowry, restricting marriage expenses and the matters connected there, with.

(18) The Code of Criminal Procedure (Haryana Amendment and Validation) Bill, 1976. (Introduced on the 28th January, 1976 and passed on the 28th January, 1976).

This Bill seeks to amend the principal Act so as to provide for the establishment of Courts of Judicial Magistrates of the Ist Class and of the IInd Class in any local area and to validate the proceedings, judgement, decree or order of the Courts of the Special Magistrates appointed in Haryana.

(19) The Haryana Legislative Assembly Speaker's Pension and Medical Facilities Bill, 1976. (Introduced on the 28th January, 1976 and passed on 28th January, 1976).

This Bill seeks to make a provision for allowing pension and medical facilities to the retiring Speakers of the Haryana Legislative Assembly after their having attained the age of fifty-five

years in order to maintain the dignity and respect of the august office of the Speaker.

RESOLUTIONS

(i) Official

1. On the 27th January, 1976, the following Official Resolution was moved by the Agriculture Minister :—

"WHEREAS this Assembly considers that in furtherance of the objectives set out in the National Forest Policy Resolution dated 12th May, 1952 of the Government of India, Ministry of Food and Agriculture, Department of Agriculture, published in the Gazette of India dated 12th May, 1952, it is expedient .to consolidate and amend the law relating to forests with a view to have a uniform law throughout India for the management and preservation of forests and forest wealth and for all matters connected therewith or ancillary or incidental. thereto;

AND WHEREAS the subject matter of such a law is relatable mainly to entry 19 (Forests), and incidentally to certain other entries, of List II of the Seventh Schedule to the Constitution of India;

AND WHEREAS Parliament has no power to make laws for the States with respect to the matters aforesaid except as provided in articles 249 and 250 of the Constitution of India;

AND WHEREAS it appears to this Assembly to be desirable that the aforesaid matters should be regulated in the State of Haryana, by Parliament, by law;

NOW, THEREFORE, in the exercise of the powers conferred by clause (1) of article 252 of the Constitution of India, this Assembly hereby resolves that all matters falling under entry 19 of List-II-State List of the Seventh Schedule to the Constitution

of India and all matters connected therewith or ancilliary or incidental thereto should be regulated in the State of Haryana, by Parliament, by law".

The Resolution was discussed for 18 minutes. Two members from the Opposition took part in the debate speaking for 14 minutes and the Chief Minister spoke for 4 minutes, by way of reply.

The Resolution was put and carried.

Observation made by the Speaker (Chaudhri Sarup Singh) on the 13th January, 1976. regarding permission to ask questions on behalf of Chaudhri Ram Lal and Chaudhri Chand Ram M.L . As., detained under MISA.

I have received a letter from Shri Ram Lal, M.L.A. who is under detention authorising Shri Shiv Ram Verma, M.L.A. to ask all the starred questions sent by him for this session and entered in the list of questions under Rule 49 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Haryana Legislative Assembly. Similarly, I have also received a letter from Chaudhri Chand Ram, M.L.A., who is under detention authorising Shri Ganpat Rai, M.L.A. to ask any starred question standing in his name during the coming session of the Vidhan Sabha.

At page 407 of the book 'Practice and Procedure of Parliament by Kaul and Shakhder (Second edition)', it has been stated that—

"The authority given by a member to another to ask questions in his absence must be in writing and specify the question and the date on which it is to be asked. A general authority for a number of days or for the entire session has not been recognised."

I have examined both the authority letters of Sarvshri Ram Lal and Chand Ram M.L.As., and found that the authority given

by them is of a general nature and for the entire session.
Hence I do not accept such an authority.

POINT OF ORDER AND DECISION THEREON

Whether an Hon'ble Member could discuss the political or social integrity of another Member while speaking on the general discussion on Budget ?
