It was later prorogued by an order of the Governor, dated the 11th October, 1979.

**SYNOPSIS OF BILL PASSED BY HARYANA VIDHAN SABHA
VIDHAN SABHA DURING THE BUDGET SESSION, 1977**

1. The Haryana Contingency Fund (Amendment) Bill, 1979.

This Bill seeks to amend the Haryana Contingency Fund (Amendment) Bill, 1966 with a view to enhance the Contingencies Fund of the State of Haryana three crores of rupees to ten crores of rupees.

2. The Haryana Board of School Education (Amendment) Bill, 1979.

This Bill seeks to amend the Haryana Board of School Education (Amendment) Bill, 1969, to enabling the State Government to dissolve the Haryana Board of School Education or remove non-official Members at its pleasure and also to exercise superintendence and Control over the Board.

3. The Medical College Rohtak (Repealing) Bill, 1979.

This Bill seeks to replace the Medical College Rohtak (Repealing) Bill, 1979, which was promulgated to repeal the Medical College Rohtak Act, 1978.

4. The Haryana Housing Board (Amendment) Bill, 1979.

This Bill seeks to amend the Haryana Housing Board (Amendment) Bill, 1971, to empower the State

Government to remove the Chairman and Members of the Board at its pleasure and also to suspend the Haryana Housing Board in Certain circumstances.

5. The Punjab Khadi and Village Industries Board (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1979.

This Bill seeks to amend the Punjab Khadi and Village Industries Board Act, 1955, in its applications to the State Government to enable the state Government to remove the Chairman, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, Joint Secretary and Other Members of Board at the pleasure of the governor, and also enable the State Government to suspend the Board in certain circumstances.

6. The Hindu Succession (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1979.

This Bill seeks to amend the Hindu Succession Act, 1955, in its to the State of Haryana with a view-

(a) to enable a female Hindu to inherit the property of her husband and not of her father;

(b) by excluding married daughters from the heirs of Class I and making others consequential changes;

(c) to restrict the right of a Hindu female to alienate the Property inherited by her from any source so as to bring her par with a Hindu male;

(d) to bring at par the living brothers, in case of succession to an issueless Hindu male by his brothers, to

inherit the property with the children of a pre-deceased brother of the Said Hindu male.

7. The Haryana Land Holdings (Amendment) Bill, 1979.

This Bill seeks to replace the Haryana Land Holdings (Amendment) Ordinance, 1979, which was promulgated to augment the State Revenue by levying surcharges on all Land Holdings above 6.25 acres.

8. The Indian Stamp (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1979

This Bill seeks to replace the Indian Stamp (Haryana Amendment) Ordinance, 1979, which was promulgated to augment the State Revenue by raising to in entry 23 and on mortgage deeds referred to in entry 40(a) of Schedule 1-A appended to the Principal Act, in its application to the State of Haryana.

9. The East Punjab war Awards (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1979.

This Bill seeks to amend the East Punjab war Awards (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1948 with a view to enhance the War Jagirs to every "eligible" persons from one hundred and fifty rupees to three hundred rupee per annum.

10. The Punjab Urban Immovable Property tax (Haryana Repealing) Bill, 1979.

This Bill seeks to repeal the Punjab Urban Immovable Property Tax Act, 1940, in its application to the

State of Haryana to abolish property tax in the State of Haryana with effect from 1st April, 1977.

11. The Haryana Public Money (Recovery of dues) Bill, 1979.

This Bill seeks to provide for the speedy recovery of certain classes of dues.

12. The Punjab Co-operative Societies (Haryana Amendment and Validation) Bill, 1979.

This Bill seeks to replace The Punjab Co-operative Societies (Haryana Amendment and Validation) Bill, 1979, which was promulgated to Validate certain acts of persons appointed to exercise and powers and perform the functions of Committees of Co-operative Societies.

13. The Haryana Public Premises and Land (Eviction and Rent Recovery) (Amendment) Bill, 1979. Clause (e) of Section 2 of the Principal Act with a view to include the shops attached to the Sainik Rest houses in the definition of Public

This Bill seeks to amend Clause (e) of Section 2 of the Principal Act with a view to include the shops attached to the Sainik Rest houses in the definition of Public Property', and to enable the Board to realize arrears of rent and to evict the tenants from such shops.

**No Confidence motion/Resolutions for removal of Speaker
and Deputy Speaker**

One notice of motion against the Speaker expressing no-confidence in him was received from Sh. Mool Chand Jain and other notice of the Resolution for the removal of the Deputy Speaker and expressing no-confidence in him was received from Sarvshri Ram Lal wadhwa, Khurshed Ahmed, Devender Sharma and Smt. Shanti Devi just after the commencement of the sitting of the Assembly on the 24th September, 1979. Theses were not allowed to be moved on 25th September, 1979, as under Article 179 (c) of the Constitution, no Resolution for the removal of the Speaker and Deputy Speaker could be moved unless 14 day's notice had been given.

Suspension of Rule 104 and suspension of Sarvshri Ganga Ram, Devi Lal, Sant Kumar and Verender Singh M.L.A. for the rest of the Session

On the 24th September, 1979, four members namely Sarvshri Ganga Ram, Devi Lal, Sant Kumar and Verender Singh M.L.A. persistently interrupted the proceedings of the House. They having been named by the Speaker for grossly disorderly conduct and asked them to withdraw from the House by the Speaker, they refused to withdraw from the House and continued to defy his orders.

In the first instance on the 4th September, 1979 the following motion for the suspension of rule 104 of the Rules and Procedure and conduct of Business in the Haryana Legislative Assembly was moved by the Local Government Minister:-

“That Rule104 of the Rules and Procedure and conduct of Business in the Haryana Legislative Assembly be suspended in its application to the motion regarding the suspension of Sarvshri Ganga Ram and Devi Lal.”

The motion was carried.

Immediately thereafter the Local Government Minister moved the following motion for suspension of Sarvshri Ganga Ram and Devi Lal for the remainder of the Session:-

“That Sarvshri Ganga Ram and Devi Lal, members of this House, having been named by the Speaker did not

withdraw from the House and continued to defy his orders. They committed gross contempt of the House and breach of privileges. This House suspends them for rest of the Session and directs the aforesaid members to absent themselves from the meetings of this House for the remainder of the present session.”

The motion was carried.

The motion having been carried, the Speaker asked these two members to leave the House which they did not do. The Speaker on finding that both the members did not withdraw themselves and finding grave disorder in the House suspended the sitting for half an hour.

The House was reassembled after half an hour and transacted some business. The Members from the Opposition raised slogans and created disorder in the House. The Speaker named Sarvshri Sant Kanwar and Verender Singh and asked them to withdraw from the House which they did not do. Ch. Ram Lal Wadhwa, a member from Treasury Benches moved the following motion for the suspension of Rule104 of the Rules and Procedure and conduct of Business in the Haryana Legislative Assembly

“That Rule104 of the Rules and Procedure and conduct of Business in the Haryana Legislative Assembly be suspended in its application to the motion regarding the suspension of Sarvshri Sant Kanwar and Verender Singh.”

The motion was put and carried.

Immediately thereafter Ch. Ram Lal Wadhwa, a member from the Treasury Benches moved the following motion for suspension of Sarvshri Sant Kanwar and Verender Singh for the remainder of the Session:-

“That Sarvshri Sant Kanwar and Verender Singh, members of this House, having been named by the Speaker did not withdraw from the House and continued to defy his orders. They committed gross contempt of the House and breach of privileges. This House suspends them for rest of the Session and directs the aforesaid members to absent themselves from the meetings of this House for the remainder of the present session.”

The motion was carried.

The motion having been put and carried, the Speaker asked these members to leave the House which they did not do. The Speaker, therefore, again adjourned the house for half na hour.

After the House reassembled, Sarvshri Sant Kanwar and Verender Singh and Ganga Ram came to the House and there was noise and disturbance. The Speaker adjourned the House till 9.30 A.M. on the 25th September, 1979

Thereafter, these four members, however, did not attend the House till 25th September, 1979, when the Assembly adjourned sine-die.

Sarvshri Devi Lal and Birender Singh (rao) from the opposition Benches and Smt. Sushma Swaraj, a member from the Treasury Benches, spoke for 7, 6 and 3 minutes, respectively.

The Speaker associated himself with the sentiments expressed by the House and spoke for 4 minutes.

(The House stood in silence for two minutes as a mark of respect to the memory of the deceased).

It was decided to send messages of condolence to the bereaved families.

II. Withdrawal of Members

After the Speaker announced the start of the Question Hour and called Ch. Kanwal Singh to put his question No. 1211, Ch. Ganga Ram, a member from the Opposition, rising on a point of Order stated that the agenda papers for today had not been received by them and, as such, it was difficult for them to participate in the proceedings.

The Speaker ruled that there could be no point of order during Question Hour and the hon. Member could see him in his Chamber and asked him to take his seat.

As the Hon. Member continued sparking in spite of the fact that he had repeatedly asked by the Speaker to resume his seat, he was named for grossly disorderly conduct and asked to withdraw from the House. On the refusal of Ch. Ganga Ram to do so, the Serjeant-at-Arms was directed by the Speaker to execute his order.

Suspension of Sitting

Before the Serjeant-at-Arms could execute the orders of the Speaker, Ch. Ganga Ram, who had been asked to withdraw from the House, was surrounded by several other members from the Opposition Benches and there was great noise and disturbance in the House.

On finding grave disorder in the House, at 2.34 p.m. the Speaker suspended the sitting for half an hour.

The House re-assembled at 3.04 p.m.

The Speaker observed that there would be no compromise so far as the maintenance of the dignity of the Chair and the House was concerned and asked the member, Ch. Ganga ram, to withdraw from the House before any other business was taken up.

Then Ch. Devi Lal got up and started speaking. He was asked by the Speaker a number of times not to interrupt the proceedings of the House in spite of which he still continued to speak. The Speaker then named him for grossly disorderly conduct and asked him to withdraw from the House but he refused to do so.

The Speaker observed that while he appreciated the feeling expressed yet, as the motion suspending Sarvshri Devi Lal and Ganga Ram, members from the Opposition Benches, had already been passed, the decision of the House should first be implemented before any other business was transacted and again asked Sarvshri Devi Lal and Ganga Ram to withdraw from the House. On their refusals to do so, the Sejeant-at-Arms was directed by the Speaker to execute his orders.

slogans and created disorder in the House as their claim for Division was not accepted by the speaker.

The Speaker named Sarvshri Sant Kanwar and Verender Singh and asked them to withdraw from the House. On their not doing so, the Serjeant-at-Arms was directed by the Speaker to execute his orders. In spite of the request made by the Serjeant-at-arms, both the members did not withdraw from the House.

Suspension of Rule 104 and suspension of Sarvshri Sant Kanwar and verender Singh

Ch. Ram Lal Wadhwa, a member from the Treasury Benches moved-

“That Rule 104 of the Rules and Procedure and conduct of Business in the Haryana Legislative Assembly be suspended in its application to the motion regarding the suspension of Sarvshri Sant Kanwar and verender Singh.”

The motion was carried.

Ch. Ram Lal Wadhwa, a member from the Treasury Benches moved-

“That Sarvshri Sant Kanwar and verender Singh, members of this House, having been named by the Speaker did not withdraw from the House and continued to defy his orders. They committed gross contempt of the House and breach of privileges. This House suspends them for rest of the Session and directs the aforesaid members to absent themselves from the meetings of this House for the remainder of the present session.”

The motion was carried.

Suspension of Sitting

At 4.45 p.m., the Speaker, finding grave disorder in the House, suspended the sitting for half-an-hour.

The House re-assembled at 3.44 p.m.

On finding the members, who already been suspended present in the House, the Speaker asked them to withdraw from the House in compliance with the decision of the House.

The Education Minister suggested that the Speaker may call a meeting of the leading members from both the sides to find out some solution so that the business of the House could be carried on in a calm and peaceful atmosphere.

The Chief Minister, the Irrigation & Power Minister and Rao Birender Singh, a Member from the Opposition, made short speeches.

The Speaker congratulated Rao Birender Singh on giving a very fair and balanced view of the whole situation and observed that the suspended members should first comply with the decision of the House and withdraw before any suggestion for conciliation was considered and a meeting held in that connection. He also advised the members who had been suspended, not only as Speaker but as friend on personal basis, to comply with the decisions of the House and withdraw.

Sarvshri verender Singh, Ganga ram and Sant Kanwar thenwithdrew from the House.

Thereafter Sh. Mool Chnad Jain, a member from the Opposition, made a short speech in connection with the happenings in the House on that day.

With a view to finding out some solution to the stalemate created in the House, the speaker invited the Chief Minister, the Education Minister, and sarvshri Mool Chand jain, rao Birender Singh and Devi lal, for a meeting in his Chamber for holding talks so that some solution could be arrived at for the smooth running of the business of the House.

X. Extension of Sitting of the House.

After taking the sense of the House, the speaker extended the sitting of the House for one hour i.e. from 6.30 p.m. to 7.30 p.m.

Suspension of the sitting

At 5.44 p.m., the sitting of the House was suspended for half-an-hour for holding a meeting for conciliation talks.

The House re-assembled at 6.14 p.m. s

As the speaker was still busy in the meetings, the sitting was further suspended till 6.25 p.m. when the House re-assembled

The speaker informed the House that in spite of frank and fair discussions, it was unfortunate that the conciliation talks could not be fruitful. The business of the House was then preceded.

The members from the oppositions suggested that the members who had been suspended and had withdrawn from the House on the personal request of the speaker be allowed to come to the House.

The Speaker observed that he could not invite those. At this stage Sarvshri Sant Kanwar, Verender Singh and Ganga Ram came to the House and there was noise and disturbance.

The speaker then adjourned the House till 9.30 a.m. on the 25th September, 1979.

II. Ejections of M.L.As from the House allegedly by the Haryana Police and violence against the Vidhan Sabha Staff.

Immediately after the question our, Ch. Kanwal Singh, a member from the Opposition , sought to raise the questions of ejections of M.L.A. from the house by Haryana Police on the night between the 24th and 25th September, 1979 and the injuries received by some of them and demanded that actions be taken against the persons responsible. He was supported in this by some other members of the oppositions.

The Chief Minister, the Industries minister and members from the treasury Benches denied the Government hand and deplored the use of violence against the assembly staff.

The Speaker while giving details of the incident of the behavior of 4 M.L.A., including three out of four M.L.A., who had been suspended from the service of the House for the remainder of the present session, kept on sitting in the Assembly Chamber on the night of 24th September, 1979 which was against the rules as under the rules had to be vacated within an hour after the adjournment of the sitting, observed that no policeman entered in the assembly Building and that none of the legislators received even a scratch when the vidhan sabha staff, acting under instructions and heavy restraint, removed them from the Assembly premises. He, however, deplored the use of violence by an M.L.A. against the vidhan Sabha staff in which Sh. Mange Ram, an employee of the Vidhan Sabha, received beatings as a result of which he became unconscious and impressed upon the M.L.A.s., to behave in a manner which raised their image in the public eye.

As for the incident outside the House in which two groups were allegedly involved in a clash resulting in injuries to a few persons, the Speaker observed that two cases had been registered with the U.T. Police in that connection and if any Member/Persons wanted to produce any evidence, he could do so. He would, however, take appropriate action in the matter only after the receipt of the enquiry report.

III. Adjournment Motion

The speaker disallowed the Adjournment Motion given notice of by Sh. Mool Chnad Jani on the 24th and 25th September Regarding withdrawal of cases against Bansi Lal, Ex-Defence Minister, Govt. of India and Ex-Chief Minister of Haryana on the ground that-

(i) it did not basic requirement of admitting an adjournment motion as no emergent situation had risen; and

(ii) the aggrieved party, if any, had the recourse to move to the court of law.

IV. Call Attention Notice.

The speaker allowed the Call Attention Notice **given notice by** Ch. Sant Kanwar and Sh. Shamsheer Singh (Nos. 3 & 5, respectively) concerning the irregular supply of canal water and electricity etc. and requested the Irrigation & Power Minister to make a statement.

The Irrigation & Power Minister to made a statement.

The Chief Minister also made a statement, by way of clarification.

V. No Confidence motion/Resolutions for removal of Speaker and Deputy Speaker

The Speaker read out the no-confidence motions given against him and the Deputy speaker as under-

(a) By Sh. Mool Chand Jain against the Speaker, namely,-

‘Due to many of his acts of omission and commission and due to his gross partiality, the House has lost confidence in the Speaker’

(b) Buy sarvshri Ram Lal Wadhwa, Khurshed Ahmed, Devenders Sharma and Mrs. Shanti Rathee against the Deputy Speaker, namely:-

‘This House has no-confidence in the Deputy Speaker, Sh. Vijai Pal Singh and he be removed from the Deputy Speaker ship immediately.’

He observed that under the constitution/Rules a notice of 14 days was mandatory before a resolution for the removals of the speaker or the deputy Speaker could be taken up. As such, he had disallowed the motion against the Deputy Speaker. As for himself, even though the motion was against the Constitutions/rules yet he was prepared to explain his positions and face it if the House permitted it.

The Chief Minister stated that the House had full confidence in the speaker and there was no need to take up the motions as it was against the constitution/Rules.

The Irrigation & power Minister supported the Chief Minister quoted a precedent when a similar motion against late Ch. Sr. Chand, Ex-Speaker, was rejected on similar grounds. He further stated that even the House could not over rule the provisions of the Constitution whereby a notice of 14 days was mandatory.
