## **SUMMONING, SITTING AND PROPAGATION OF THE HARYANA VIDHAN SABHA**

The Haryana Vidhan Sabha was summoned to meet for its Sixth Session in the Hall of the Haryana Vidhan Bhawan, Chandigarh, on the 28th February, 1979 by an order of the Governor, dated the 4th February, 1977, and continued to meet till the 30<sup>th</sup> March, 1979, when it was adjourned sine-die. It was later prorogued by an order of the Governor, dated the 4th April, 1979.

During the Session, the Sabha held 20 sittings as may be seen from the programme observed, excluding the one relating to Governor's Address to the Assembly.

## **FINANCIAL BUSINESS**

The Budget Estimates for the year 1979-80 were presented by the Finance Minister on the 7th March, 1979.

#### **(i) General Discussion.**

The Total time taken by Treasury Benches was 9 hours and 53 minutes and by Opposition 2 hours 40 minutes. The total number of members, who participated, was 34(26 from the Treasury Benches 8 from the Opposition).

**(ii) Demands for grants**

There were in all 25 Demands for the Grants totaling a sum of Rs. 7,76,00,18,755 (voted Rs.5,61,58,99,170 charged Rs. 2,14,41,19,585)

All the demands were deemed to have been read and moved in the House on the 23<sup>rd</sup>, 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> March, 1979. The Speaker permitted the discussion on all the Demands for grants and requested the Members to indicate the number of Demands on which a member wish to raise discussion.

the cut motions on Demands Nos: 2, 3, 9, 12, 15, 17, and 22 given notice of by Sarvshri Surrender Singh, Shamsher Singh Surjewala, Inderjit Singh and jai Narian Singh, Members of Opposition were put and Lost.

All Demands (1 -25) were put to the House on the 23<sup>rd</sup>, 26<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup> March, 1979 and carried.

### **The Haryana Appropriation (No. 2) Bill, 1979**

The Haryana Appropriation (No. 2) Bill, 1979 (Bill, No. 9-HLA of 1979) in respect of the demands voted by the Sabha on the 23<sup>rd</sup>, 26<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup> March, 1979, was introduced on the 28<sup>th</sup> March, 1979.

It was before the Sabha for 103 minutes, 4 members from the Treasury benches (including the Finance Minister in moving the motion and by way of reply, and 2 from the Opposition, participated in the debate speaking for 74 minutes and 25 minutes, respectively. 4 minutes were taken in putting the other motion.

The Bill was passed.

### **(2) The Supplementary Estimates (Third Installment) 1978-79.**

(i) The Supplementary Estimates (Third Installment) 1976-77 were presented to the Sabha on the 6<sup>th</sup> March, 1979 and voted on the 9<sup>th</sup> March, 1979

There were 15 demands in all totalling a sum of Rs. 35,94,55,785 (voted: Rs. 28,19,51,889; charged: Rs. 7,75,03,896). As desired by the House, a general discussion was permitted on the Supplementary Estimates.

One Member from the Opposition and four Members including Finance Minister from the Treasury Benches spoke for 8 minutes and 76 minutes, respectively..

All the demands were put and carried.

**(ii) The Haryana Appropriation Bill, 1979.**

The Haryana Appropriation Bill, 1979 (Bill No. 3 HLA of 1979) in respect of Supplementary Estimates (Third Installment) 1978-79, granted by the House on the 9<sup>th</sup> March, 1979 was introduced on the 16<sup>th</sup> March, 1979.

The total sum to be authorized out of the Consolidated Fund of the State was Rs. 35,94,55,785

Five Members including Finance Minister from the Treasury Benches and 2 Member from the Opposition spoke for 97 minutes and 31 minutes, respectively..

It remained before the House for 2 minutes.

4 minutes were taken in putting the other motions.

The Bill was passed.

## **LEGISLATION**

The Sabha considered Legislative Business on the 8th March, 16<sup>th</sup> March, 28<sup>th</sup> March and 30<sup>th</sup> 1979. The Sabha Passed 9 Bills including 2 Appropriation Bills in respect Budget for the year 1979-80 and Supplementary Estimates (Third Installment) for the year 1978-79.

**SYNOPSIS OF BILL PASSED BY HARYANA VIDHAN SABHA  
VIDHAN SABHA DURING THE BUDGET SESSION HELD IN  
FEBRUARY-MARCH, 1979.**

**1. The Haryana Ceiling on Land Holdings (Amendment) Bill, 1979** (Introduced on the 16th March, 1979 and passed on the 16<sup>th</sup> March, 1979).

This Bill seeks to omit sub-sections (7) and (9) of Section 18 of the Haryana Ceiling on Land Holdings Act, 1972, where in a sum equivalent to thirty-times of Land Holdings Tax for filing an appeal or revision was required to be deposited by an aggrieved party.

**2. The Haryana Appropriation Bill, 1979** (Introduced on the 16th March, 1979 and passed on the 16<sup>th</sup> March, 1979).

This Bill seeks to authorize payment and appropriation of certain further sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Haryana for the services of the financial year ending on the thirty-first day of March, 1979.

**3. The Haryana Legislative Assembly (Allowances and Pension of Members) Amendment Bill, 1979** (Introduced on the 19th March, 1979 and passed on the 19<sup>th</sup> March, 1979).

This Bill seeks to amend the Haryana Legislative Assembly (Allowances and Pension of Members) Act, 1975, allowing free

non-transferable passes to the Members of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha for traveling in any public vehicle of the Haryana State Transport Under taking or of the Pepsu road Transport Corporation, instead of one.

**4. The Haryana Legislative Assembly Facilities to members Amendment Bill, 1979 (Introduced on the 28th March, 1979 and passed on the 28<sup>th</sup> March, 1979).**

This Bill seeks to provide certain facilities to Members of the Haryana Legislative Assembly such as house building advance up to Rs. forty-five thousand and car advanced up to Rs. thirty thousand.

**5. The Haryana Legislative Assembly Speaker's and Deputy Speaker's Salaries and Allowances (Amendment) Bill, 1979 (Introduced on the 28th March, 1979 and passed on the 28<sup>th</sup> March, 1979).**

This Bill seeks to amend the Haryana Legislative Assembly Speaker's and Deputy Speaker's Salaries and Allowances Act, 1975, with a view to enhance the limit of Motor Car Advance from Rs. 26,000/- to Rs. thirty thousand in respect of Speaker and Deputy Speaker, Haryana Vidhan Sabha.

**6. The Haryana Appropriation (No.2) Bill, 1979 (Introduced on the 28th March, 1979 and passed on the 28<sup>th</sup> March, 1979).**

This Bill seeks to authorize payment and appropriation of certain sums from and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Haryana for services the financial year ending on the thirty-first day of March, 1980.

**7. The Punjab Agricultural Produce Markets (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1979 (Introduced on the 28th March, 1979 and passed on the 28<sup>th</sup> March, 1979).**

This Bill seeks to amend the Principal Act so as to give more representations to the Producers in the Committee so that the interest of the Producers be safeguarded. Further to ensure representation to Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes/Backward classes a provision for their co-option by the elected members of the committee etc. has been made.

**8. The Haryana Municipal (Amendment) Bill, 1979 (Introduced on the 30th March, 1979 and passed on the 30<sup>th</sup> March, 1979).**

This Bill seeks to amend various provisions of the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973, to overcome hardships caused to the members elected through democratic process and to the public at large.

**9. The Haryana General Sales Tax (Amendment) Bill, 1979 (Introduced on the 30th March, 1979 and passed on the 30<sup>th</sup> March, 1979).**

This Bill seeks to amend the Haryana General Sales Tax Act, 1973, with a view to exempt the tiny industrial units in the rural areas from levy of sales tax and purchase tax for the development of Industries in the rural areas in the State.

**10. The Haryana Affiliated Colleges (Security of Service) Bill, 1979 (Introduced on the 30h March, 1979 and passed on the 30<sup>th</sup> March, 1979).**

This Bill seeks to provide for security of services to employees of affiliated colleges.

## **RESOLUTION**

### **(i) Official**

1. On the 23rd March, 1979, the following official Resolution was moved by the Health Minister:-

“This House feels that the rapid pace of growth of Population in Haryana is not only an obstruction in raising the standard of s living of the people but is also a potential threat to the socio economic stability of the State. As such the house supports the policy of the Govt. to wards limitation of the population through family Welfare measures. The House further resolves that Family Welfare Programme be persuaded vigorously as a wholly voluntary programme and as internal part of the comprehensive policy covering Education, Health, maternity and Child Care, family welfare and nutrition.

This house also feels that the Govt. and all social, religious and political organizations must join hands to motivate the people to accept the programme of population limitation voluntarily in their own interest, in the interest of their children and in the large interest of the nation.”

The Resolution was discussed for 46 minutes. Five members from Treasury Benches including the Health Minister and one member from Opposition Benches spoke for 44 minutes and 2 minutes, respectively.

The Resolution was put and carried.

Since however, the resolution of Sh. Sant Kanwar, M.L.A., appeared at No. 1 according to the Ballot drawn, he could move his Resolution.

Accordingly Singh Sant Kanwar, a Member from the Treasury Benches, while moving the Resolution-

“With a view to commemorate the birth centenary of Late Ch. Chhotu Ram who dedicated his life for the uplift & betterment of the peasantry, this House recommends to State Government to constitute a Committee comprising the renowned academicians, Social Workers, Literatures and Parliamentarians for suggesting to the Government to take suitable steps to pay homage to the illustrious son of the nation by celebrating the occasion in a befitting manner which falls in the year, 1981 at a State level.”

Spoke for 13 minutes.

Three members from the Treasury Benches including the mover and one member from the Opposition Benches took part in the discussion and spoke for 31 minutes and 8 minutes, respectively.

The Minister for Jails and Cultural Affairs and Irrigation and Power Ministers spoke for one minute each.

The Resolution was, by leave of the House, withdrawn.

**III. On 1<sup>st</sup> March, 1979, Swami Aditya Vesh, a member from the Treasury Benches while moving the Resolution-**

“This House recommends to the State Govt. to provide Unemployment Allowance to the educated persons of Haryana domicile residing within the state.”

Spoke for 11 minutes.

6 members from the Treasury Benches including the mover and 3 members from the Opposition Benches took part in the discussion and spoke for 32 minutes and 19 minutes, respectively.

The Co-operation and Dairy Development Minister spoke for 8 minutes.

Spoke for 16 minutes.

The Resolution was, by leave of the House, withdrawn.

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## **POINTS OF ORDERS AND DECISIONS THEREON**

**1. Could a member read out his written speech in the House?**

**It was held that a member could not read his written speech. However, he could consult his notes.**

(On the 5<sup>th</sup> March, 1979, when Ch. Inderjit Singh was speaking on the Motion of Thanks on the Governor's Address, Sh. Jagan Nath raised this point of order and the chairman gave above ruling\_.

**2. Whether the Deputy Speaker could take part in the discussion as a party-man in view of the fact that the Speaker and the Deputy Speaker were non-partisan in the House?**

It was held when the speaker was in the chairs, The Deputy Speaker could take part in the discussion and there was no bar under the rules whereby he could do so. Besides, there was a precedent where the Deputy Speaker had been participating in the debates of the House.

(On the 6<sup>th</sup> March, 1979, when the Deputy Speaker was participating in the discussion on the Motion of Thanks on the Governor's Address, Rao Birinder Singh raised this point of order and the speaker gave the above ruling).

**3. Whether five Call Attention motions could be admitted for one day when under rule 73 of the Rules of**

**Procedure and Conduct of Business only one call Attention motion could be admitted?**

It was held that since the Call Attention motions were on one and the same subject those had been treated as one and the Minister concerned would also make only one statement in respect of all of them.

(On the 9<sup>th</sup> March, 1979 when five Call Attention motions in the names of different members belonging to the Treasury Benches on the same subject were admitted, Sh. Shamsher Singh Surjewala, a member of the opposition Benches raised this point of order and the Dy. Speaker gave the above ruling).

**4. Whether questions could be allowed to be asked on the statement made by a minister in reply to a call attention Motion when Rule 73 of the assembly Rules provided that there shall be no debate on such statement?**

It was held that under direction (No. HVS/LA-12/79 dated 27.2.79) issued by the Speaker under Rule 120 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Haryana Legislative Assembly, member(s) who had given notice of the Call Attention Motion, could be permitted to ask two questions to seek further clarification on the statement .

(On the 9<sup>th</sup> March, 1979, when questions had been allowed to be asked on the statement made by the Revenue Minister in reply to Call Attention Motion, Sh. Baldev Tayal and Smt. Sushma Swarj both members of the Treasury Benches raised this Point of Order and the Dy. Speaker gave the above ruling).

**5. Whether a Call Attention Motion which, after having been admitted by the Speaker under Rule 73 had become the property of the House and on which the Minister concerned had promised to make a statement could be withdrawn?**

The Speaker-

(i) According to Practice and Procedure in Parliament by Kaul and Shakhder, page 412, a calling attention notice, which had been admitted and put down in the list of business, may be withdrawn by the member concerned with the chair's permission on so stating his intention on the floor of the House. In this Case, as the member concerned had to go out, he had given his intention for withdrawal of the said call attention notice in writing and he had accorded the necessary permission and made the announcements in the House on 23.3.79; and

(ii) Under Rule 112 of the Assembly rules, the member could raise the objection immediately after the announcements of its withdrawal was made and not after a laps of time when the public works Minister had already made his statement in reply to another Call attention notice.

(on the 23<sup>rd</sup> March, 1979, sometime after the Speaker made an observation that Call Attention Motion No. 14 given notice of by Sh. Har Swarup Buras, M.L.A., regarding charging of Rs.35/- to Rs. 45/-per acre from the farmers for lining the water courses, on which the Minister was to make a statement that day 23.3.1979 had been withdraw and therefore, the Minister need not make a statement thereon,

Smt. Sushma Sawarj, a member of the Treasury Benches, raised the above point of order and the Speaker gave the sad ruling on the 26thMarch, 1979).



## **OBSERVATIONS MADE BY THE SPEAKER**

**1. Observation made by the Speaker (Col. Rao ram Singh) on 19.3.79 on the question of alleged contempt of the House against Sh. Surrender Singh, M.L.A. for making a misleading statement in the House.**

It is an established principle and convention that the Speaker of the house maintains absolute impartiality in the performance of the duties. This practice and convention I have endeavored to follow in the strictest sense of the word and to the best of my ability. How far I have succeeded in this objective is not for me to say but for the hon'ble members of the House to judge.

This particular Privilege motions was referred to the Privileges Committee When I was holding the portfolio of Education. Since now I am occupying this chair of Speaker, it is my considered opinion that whilst occupying the chair I should not be associated or be a party to any privilege motion. In the consideration of this question the House, of course, is the final authority.

**2. Observation made by the Speaker (Col. Rao Ram Singh) on the 22<sup>nd</sup> March, 1979 (Evening Sitting) regarding the publication of a news item in the daily 'Vir Partap about the adjournment of the House on 21.3.79.**

It has been brought to mu notice that reports have appeared in the section of the Press, particularly in 'Vir

Partap' ahindi Newspaper regarding the adjournment of the House on 21.3.79

I quote the relevant, sentence from 'Vir Partap. Referring to the speech by Dr. Magal Sein, the Paper had reported as under-

'अन्य सदस्यों द्वारा इसका विरोध किये जाने पर बैठक को कल के लिए स्थगित करना पड़ा।'

I wish to point out that the implied meaning behind this statement is incorrect. The House was adjourned at the stipulated, normal hour of interruption i.e. 1300 hours. I would request the representatives of the newspaper to ensure that the proceedings are correctly reported.

## **RULING GIVEN BY THE SPEAKER**

### **1. Ruling given by the Speaker (Col. Rao Ram Singh) on 2<sup>nd</sup> March, 1979 holding out of order privilege motion given notice of by Sh. Shamsher Singh Surjewala against Ch. Ram Lal Wadhwa Local Govt. Minister.**

Hon'ble Members considering the seriousness of the matter, I have personally devoted great thought and have personally examined the case in the minutes of details. I spent at least four hours yesterday going through the records of the sittings of the House held on the 27<sup>th</sup> December, 1978. I have also examined the motion submitted by Sh. Surjewala and the documents submitted by Sh. Ram Lal Wadhwa.

While examining the highest tradition of the maintenance of democratic traditions followed by this August House, as also the established traditions of the complete impartiality and fairness of the office of the Speaker

Even so, I will briefly bring out the facts of the case before the House. There are as follows:-

Sh. Shamsher Singh Stated as follows:

‘उपाध्यक्ष महोदय, जो लोकल बाडीज के मंत्री हैं उनके खिलाफ आज करनाल के सी.जी.एम. की कोर्ट में 193 आई.पी.सी. के तहत कम्प्लेन्ट दर्ज है।’

In reply thereto, Sh. Ram Lal Wadhwa, Local Govt. Minister stated as follows:

‘डिप्टी स्पीकर साहब, चूंकि इन्होंने हाउस में मामला उठाया है इसलिए मैं इन्हें बात देता हूं कि कल दिनांक 26-12-78 को सी.जी.एम. साहब ने फैसला सुना दिया है और उस केस को डिसमिस कर दिया है।’

Sh. Shamsheer Singh again stated:-

अगर सी.जी.एम. साहब ने कल फैसला दे दिया है तो भी कल से पहले तो ये मंत्री रहे। आठ महीने से मूलजिम होते हुए भी ये यहां विराजमान रहे।

After some interruptions, Sh. Ram Lal Wadhwa, Local Govt. Minister again replied as follows:

This was merely a complaint by some persons....  
(Interruption).

..... Any person can file any complaint against any one.

In the end Sh. Shamsheer Singh Surjewala against stated as follows:

‘वह किसी मामूली आदमी की कम्प्लेन्ट नहीं थी बल्कि पंजाब और हरियाणा हाई कोर्ट के फारमर चीफ जस्टिस श्री ए.डी. कौ ल ने वह कम्प्लेन्ट कर रखी थी अगर आप बरी हो गए हैं तो अच्छी बात है।’

(Interruptions)

Now the pertinent facts as revealed after my detailed examinations are as follows:

While the notice of question of breach of privilege was under examinations in my Secretariat, Sh. ram Lal Wadhwa also addressed a letter dated 1.3.79 in this regard. An examinations of the documents attached with this letter reveals that there certainly was against a case Sh. Ram Lal Wadhwa in the court of Chief Judicial Magistrate. This was heard and dismissed on 26.12.78 and as such Sh. Ram Lal Wadhwa did not make any false statement about the dismissal of a case on 26.3.78 in the court of the chief Judicial Magistrate, Karnal.

The documents submitted along with the notice givens by Sh. Surjewala have been examined by me. Rule 262 of the Rules of Procedure and conduct of business in the Haryana Legislative Assembly states that if a notice refers to a document, the document should be attached with the notice. The document submitted by Sh. Surjewala attested by him personally and not certified by the court. It is a normal procedure that the Court's documents should be attested by the Court from which they are obtained. The document submitted by him is not attested by the court. On this ground alone the document are not maintainable. Kaul and Shakhthar in their widely accepted treatise on the Practice and Procedure of Parliament at page 252 have stated that question of breach of privilege to be in order should contain a deliberate lie. In this Particular case, the statement was made by the minister on the spur of the moment and can by no stretch of imagination be termed as a deliberate one.

After giving due consideration to all these facts stated above, I hereby rule that this notice of privilege is out of order and hence I withhold my consent to raise this question of privilege.

**2. Ruling given by the Speaker (Col Rao Ram Singh) on 22<sup>nd</sup> March, 1979. (Morning Sitting) regarding the use of Language in the House.**

मैम्बर साहेबान, जो लैंग्विज का सवाल है इसके बारे में मैं एक दफा पहले बहुत डिटेल्ड रूलिंग दे चुका हूँ और मैं आप लोगों के सामने फिर पढ़ना चाहता हूँ। The question of use of language in the Assembly यानी असैम्बली के अन्दर क्या भाशा इस्तेमाल की जाएगी यह सवाल काफी दफा रेज हो चुका है, कई मैम्बर साहेबान ने रेज किया है। I regret to say that this point has been agitated time and again by the members without proper appreciation of the rules of Procedure. I would invite the attention of the members to rule 77 of our Rules of Procedure which reads as under-

“Subject to the provisions of Article 210 of the Constitution, the proceeding in the assembly shall be conducted in Hindi or Punjabi or in English language.”

Even according to Article 210 of the Constitution, the business in the legislature of a State shall be transacted in the official language or languages of the State or in Hindi or in English. Besides, according to section 5 of the Haryana Official Language Act, 1969, unless and until the State Govt.

otherwise directs by the notification, the English language may, as from the appointment day, continue to be used, in addition to Hindi, for the transaction of the business in the Legislature of the State.

It will thus be seen that according to the aforesaid provisions, the proceedings in the Assembly shall be conducted in Hindi or in Punjabi or in English and as such it is apparent that all the three languages can be used for the transactions of proceeding in the House. लेकिन मैं हाउस को अ योर करना चाहता हूँ कि हिन्दी को ऐनकरेज और प्रोमोट करने के लिए मैं पूरी कोशिश कर रहा हूँ और भायद मैम्बर साहेबान ने यह नोटिस किया होगा कि हरेक रूलिंग या जो मोज पर वोटिंग का मामला होता है वह मैं हिन्दी में कंडक्ट कर रहा हूँ लेकिन जो शिक्षा मंत्री ने प्वायंट रेज किया है, मैं शिक्षा मंत्री के प्वायंट से सौ फीसदी सहमत हूँ कि अगर किसी चीज को प्रोत्साहन देना हो तो आहिस्ता—आहिस्ता अपने दिल और अपने दिमाग से दिया जाता है। अगर कोई चीज किसी पर ठोसी जाती है तो उसकी अपोजीशन पैदा होती है। जो मैम्बर ऐसा करते हैं वे उसकी डिससर्विस कर रहे हैं, उसकी सर्विस नहीं कर रहे हैं। मैं सबसे रिक्वेस्ट करना चाहता हूँ कि हिन्दी के प्रयोग में वे पूरा सहयोग दें और हिन्दी का ज्यादा से ज्यादा इस्तेमाल किया जाए लेकिन मेहरबानी करके इसको किसी के ऊपर थोपने की कोशिश करने के बारे में न सोचें। इससे हाउस का वक्त जाया होता है। बहुत से मैम्बर साहेबान बोलना चाहते हैं लेकिन इसी

चीज में हाउस का समय जाया हो रहा है। इसलिए मैं आप सब का सहयोग चाहूंगा और मेरी आप से रिक्वेस्ट है कि आप इसमें मेरी मदद करें।

**3. Ruling given by the Speaker (Col Rao Ram Singh) on 22<sup>nd</sup> March, 1979, regarding the withdrawal of a Call Attention Motion which having been admitted under rule 73 had become the property of the House and on which the Minister concerned had promised to make a statement.**

“A calling attention notice has been admitted and put down in the list of business may be withdrawn by the member concerned with the chair’s permission on so stating on the floor of the House.”



यानि मैम्बर साहब जिन्होंने नोटिस दिया है वह उसे वापिस स्पीकर की इजाजत से ले सकते हैं। यह बात आन दी फ्लोर आफ दी हाउस कह करके कि मैं इसे वापिस लेना चाहता हूं। उस दिन भी हरस्वरूप बूरा गैर हाजिर थे। उन्होंने कहीं जाना था। इसलिए वे हाउस में नहीं आ सके। लिखित रूप में वे मेरे को दे गए थे। उसे मैंने हाउस में पढ़ कर सुना दिया था और उस पर अपना फैसला भी दे दिया था। पहली बात तो यह है। दूसरी बात यह है कि हमारे रूलज आफ प्रोसीजर एण्ड कंडक्ट ऑफ बिजनैस के रूल 112 में यह है कि अगर किसी ने किसी बात पर एतराज उठाना हो तो उसे उसी वक्त उठाना चाहिए। सुशमा जी ने यह एतराज उस वक्त नहीं उठाया था बल्कि सरदार लछमन सिंह जी जब अपनी पूरी स्टैटमेंट दे चुके उसके बाद उठाया। इन दोनों बेसिज पर इस प्वायंट आफ आर्डर को रद्द किया जाता है।

#### **II. Question of breach of privilege.**

The Speaker withheld his consent to the raising of a question of breach of privilege given by Sh. Shamsheer Singh Surjewala, M.L.A. concerning a deliberate misleading statement made by Sh. Ram Lal Wadhwa, Local Govt. Minister on the 27<sup>th</sup> December, 1978, thereby committing a grave contempt of the privileges of the House and holding it out of order ruled as under:-

Hon'ble Members considering the seriousness of the matter, I have personally devoted great thought and have personally examined the case in the minutes of details. I spent at least four hours yesterday going through the records of the sittings of the House held on the 27<sup>th</sup> December, 1978. I have also examined the motion submitted by Sh. Surjewala and the documents submitted by Sh. Ram Lal Wadhwa.

While examining the highest tradition of the maintenance of democratic traditions followed by this August House, as also the established traditions of the complete impartiality and fairness of the office of the Speaker

Even so, I will briefly bring out the facts of the case before the House. There are as follows:-

Sh. Shamsheer Singh Stated as follows:

'उपाध्यक्ष महोदय, जो लोकल बॉडीज के मंत्री हैं उनके खिलाफ आज करनाल के सी.जी.एम. की कोर्ट में 193 आई.पी.सी. के तहत कम्प्लेन्ट दर्ज है।'

In reply thereto, Sh. Ram Lal Wadhwa, Local Govt. Minister stated as follows:

'डिप्टी स्पीकर साहब, चूंकि इन्होंने हाउस में मामला उठाया है इसलिए मैं इन्हें बता देता हूं कि कल दिनांक 26-12-78 को सी.जी.एम. साहब ने फैसला सुना दिया है और उस केस को डिसमिस कर दिया है।'

‘अगर सी.जी.एम. साहब ने कल फैसला दे दिया है तो भी कल से पहले तो ये मंत्री रहे। आठ महीने से मुलजिम होत हुए भी ये यहां विराजमान रहे।’

After some interruptions, Sh. Ram Lal Wadhwa, Local Govt. Minister again replied as follows:

This was merely a complaint by some persons....  
(Interruptions)

Any person can file any complaint against any one.

In the end Sh. Shamsheer Singh Surjewala against stated as follows:

‘वह किसी मामूली आदमी की कम्प्लेन्ट नहीं थी बल्कि पंजाब और हरियाणा हाई कोर्ट के फारमर चीफ जस्टिस श्री ए.डी. कौ ल ने वह कम्प्लेन्ट कर रखी थी अगर आप बरी हो गए हैं तो अच्छी बात है। (Interruptions)’

Now the pertinent facts as revealed after my detailed examinations are as follows:

While the notice of question of breach of privilege was under examinations in my Secretariat, Sh. ram Lal Wadhwa also addressed a letter dated 1.3.79 in this regard. An examinations of the documents attached with this letter reveals that there certainly was against a case Sh. Ram Lal Wadhwa in the court of Chief Judicial Magistrate. This was heard and dismissed on 26.12.78 and as such Sh. Ram Lal Wadhwa did not make any false statement about the dismissal

of a case on 26.3.78 in the court of the chief Judicial Magistrate, Karnal.

The documents submitted along with the notice givens by Sh. Surjewala have been examined by me. Rule 262 of the Rules of Procedure and conduct of business in the Haryana Legislative Assembly states that if a notice refers to a document, the document should be attached with the notice. The document submitted by Sh. Surjewala attested by him personally and not certified by the court. It is a normal procedure that the Court's documents should be attested by the Court from which they are obtained. The document submitted by him is not attested by the court. On this ground alone the document are not maintainable. Kaul and Shakdhar in their widely accepted treatise on the Practice and Procedure of Parliament at page 252 have stated that question of breach of privilege to be in order should contain a deliberate lie. In this Particular case, the statement was made by the minister on the spur of the moment and can by no stretch of imagination be termed as a deliberate one.

After giving due consideration to all these facts stated above, I hereby rule that this notice of privilege is out of order and hence I with hold my consent to raise this question of privilege.

### **Walk Out**

Sarvshri Shamsheer Singh Surjewala, raised objection to the non-admission of his privilege motion stated that the same be put to the vote of the House under rule 264

(2) of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of business but the Speaker observed that he had given his ruling after a very deliberate and thorough examination of the question and that if there was anything further, the Member could discuss it with him in his chamber.

Sarvshri Birender Singh (Rao), Dalip Singh (Rao), Shamsheer Singh Surjewala & Mange Ram Gupta, all members of the Opposition staged a walk out in protest.

### **III. Call Attention Notice.**

The Speaker admitted the Call Attention notice no. 3 given notice of Sh. Har Swarup Bura, M.L.A., Regarding Fierce wide spread devastation of the crops in about 30 villages of Bahadurgarh sub-division, 10 villages of Meham Block and Nahar sub-Tehsil caused by a severe and firestorm on 19.3.79 and asked the minister concerned to make a statement.

The Finance Minister made a statement.

### **IV. Withdrawal of members**

(i) During the question hour Swami Agnivesh, a member of the treasury Benches, raised objection to the giving of a reply to a Starred question in English language by the Minister concerned and wanted that the same be given in Hindi Language. The Speaker observed that Hindi and English Language being the languages of the House under the Rules,

the Minister could use/speak in any of the two languages. But the Member persisted with his demand and continued speaking despite repeated requests of the Speaker to resume his seat. Thereupon the Speaker named the Member and rendered him to withdraw from the House. As the Member did not withdraw from the House and continued speaking, the Sergeant-at-arms was directed to remove the member from the House, who went to the seat of the member and requested him to leave the House. The member thereafter left the House.

(ii) Swami Aditya vesh a member of the Treasury Benches started speaking about the call attention notice given by him without the permission of the speaker. He was asked to resume his seat but he went on speaking despite the request of the Speaker to resume his seat. The Speaker named the member and ordered him to withdraw from the house, who did so accordingly.

A little later, on request of Smt. Sushma Sewarj, a members of the Treasury Benches, Swami Agni vesh and Swami Aditya vesh were allowed to attend the House by the Deputy Speaker who was in the Chair at that time.

(a) It was a subject matter for the Central Govt. and, as such, the Lok Sabha was the proper forum for that subject and not the Haryana Vidhan Sabha; and

(b) vide Practice and Procedure of Parliament by Kaul and Shakdhar, the provisions of the Finance bill regarding imposition and increase in duties of customs or excise came into force immediately on the expiry of the day on which the Bill was introduced.

(ii) The Speaker disallowed the Call Attention motion given notice of Sh. Aditya Vesh, M.L.A., concerning in Benamis in post offices in Haryana on the ground that it concerned the department of Post and Telegraph which was a Central Govt. subject and, as such, could not be discussed in the Haryana Vidhan Sabha and that a question on that subject had been discussed in Lok Sabha, therefore undoubtedly the Central Govt. must be seized of the problem.

During the question hour Swami Aditya vesh, a member of the treasury Benches, raised objection to the giving of a reply to a Starred question in English language by the Minister concerned and wanted that the same be given in Hindi Language. the Speaker observed that Hindi and English

Language being the languages of the House under the Rules, the Minister could use/speak in any of the two languages. But the Member persisted with his demand and continued speaking despite repeated requests of the Speaker to resume his seat. A little later, on the suggestion of the co-operation and Dairy Development Minister both the members were allowed to attend the House of the Speaker.

**III. Ruling by the Speaker regarding use of language in the House.**

When the education minister started replying to starred question on English Language there was again demand from various members giving the reply in the Hindi language. Thereupon the Speaker gave the following ruling-

“Hon. members, the questions of use language in the Assembly has often been raised in this House by various members. I regret to say that this point has been agitated time and again by the members without proper appreciation of the rules of Procedure. I would invite the attention of the members to rule 77 of our Rules of Procedure which reads as under-

“Subject to the provisions of Article 210 of the Constitution, the proceeding in the assembly shall be conducted in Hindi or Punjabi or in English language.”

Even according to Article 210 of the Constitution, the business in the legislature of a State shall be transacted in the official language or languages of the State or in Hindi or in English. Besides, according to section 5 of the Haryana Official Language Act, 1969, unless and until the State Govt. otherwise directs by the notification, the English language may, as from the appointment day, continue to be used, in addition to Hindi, for the transaction of the business in the Legislature of the State.

It will thus be seen that according to the aforesaid provisions, the proceedings in the Assembly shall be conducted in Hindi or in Punjabi or in English and as such it is apparent that all the three languages can be used for the

When Swami Aditya Vesh, a member of the Treasury Benches, continued to speak on the privileges motion given notice of by him which had been disallowed by the Speaker in his chamber, he was repeatedly asked by the Speaker not to do so. On his not obeying the orders of the Speaker and ordered to withdraw from the House. As the Member did not withdraw from the House and continued speaking the Sergeant-at-Arms was directed to remove the Member from the House, who went to the seat of the Member and requested him to leave of the House. The Member thereafter left the House.

## **STATEMENT BY THE FINANCE MINISTER**

The Finance Minister informed the House that the Bill to check evasion of sales tax on goods transported from Haryana could not be presented during the session, as promised by him earlier. This was due to the fact that the Bill had been sent for the President's approval which was still awaited. Its provisions would, therefore, be enforced through an Ordinance.

### **XI. Walk Out**

Ch. Birinder Singh followed by Sarvshri Jagjit Singh Pohloo Mabnge Ram Gupta and Inderjit Singh, all members of the the Opposition Benches, staged a walk out as a protest against the passage of clause 8 of the Haryana Affiliated Colleges (Security of Service) Bill, 1979, which, according to them was anti-democratic.

The Deputy Speaker Occupied the Chair from 11.10 a.m. to 12.37 p.m.

The Sabha then adjourned sine-die.
