SUMMONING, SITTING AND PROPAGATION OF THE HARYANA VIDHAN SABHA

The Haryana Vidhan Sabha was summoned to meet for its Eight (MARCH) session, 1980 in the Hall of the Haryana Vidhan Bhawan, Chandigarh, on the 3rd March, 1980 by an order of the Governor, dated the 8th February, 1980, and continued to meet till the 21th March, 1980, when it was adjourned sine-die. It was later prorogued by an order of the Governor, dated the 27th March, 1980.

During the Session, the Sabha held 17 sittings as may be seen from the programme observed, excluding the one relating to Governor's Address to the Assembly.

Consequent upon the resignation from the Assembly seat w.e.f. 19th may, 1980, Brig Ran Singh M.L.A., a Special Invitee of the Ad-hoc Committee automatically ceased to be a member of the Committee w.e.f. 19th may, 1980.

The term of the Committee which was due to expire on the 30th June, 1980 was extended by the Hon'ble Speaker up to the 31st December, 1980

Dr. Mangal sein, M.L.A., was nominated by the Hon'ble Speaker on the 12th June, 1980, as a special invitee to serve on the Ad-hoc Committee for the remaining period of the Committee i.e. up to 31st December, 1980.

Ch. Har Swroop Bura, M.L.A. resigned from the membership of the Committee on 12th June, 1980.

Sh. Mool Chand Jain, M.L.A, a special invitee of the Committee resigned from the membership of the committees' w.e.f. 15th September, 1980.

Ch. Rizaq Ram, M.L.A., resigned from the membership of the Committee on 14th October, 1980.

GOVERNOR'S ADDRESS

(ii) Demands for grants

There were in all 25 Demands for the Grants totaling a sum of Rs. 8,60,29,98,025.

All the demands were deemed to have been read and moved in the House on the 18th and 19th March, 1980. The Speaker permitted the discussion on all the Demands for grants and requested the Members to indicate the number of Demands on which a member wished to raise discussion

The demands were discussed on the 25th March, 1977 (Evening Sitting) for 77 minutes (Treasury 12 minutes and Opposition 65 minutes).

(iii) The Haryana Appropriation (No.3) Bill, 1980

The Haryana Appropriation (No. 3) Bill, 1980 (Bill, No. 17-HLA of 1980) in respect of the demands voted by the Sabha on the 18th and 19th March, 1980 (First Sitting). It was

before the Sabha for 136 minutes. 4 members from the Treasury benches (including the Finance Minister in moving the motion and by way of reply, and 4 from the Opposition, participated in the debate speaking for 73 minutes and 63 minutes, respectively.

The Bill was passed.

(2) The Supplementary Estimates (Third Installment) 1979-80.

(i) The Supplementary Estimates) 1979-80 were presented to the Sabha on the 7th March, 1980 and voted on the 11th March, 1980.

There were 18 demands in all totalling a sum of Rs.393326845. As desired by the House, a general discussion was permitted on the Supplementary Estimates.

5 from the Opposition, (including the Finance Minister 4 members from the Treasury benches spoke for 80 minutes and 53 minutes, respectively.

All the demands were put and carried.

(ii) The Haryana Appropriation (No.2) Bill, 1980.

The Haryana Appropriation Bill, 1977 (Bill No. 15 HLA of 1980) in respect of Supplementary Estimates (1979-80, granted by the House on the 11th March, 1980 was introduced on the 20th March, 1980.

One member from the Treasury benches and 3 from the Opposition benches spoke for 12 minutes and 19 minutes respectively.

It remained before the House for 2 minutes.

The Bill was passed.

(3) (i) Excess Demands over Grants and Appropriations for the year 1974-75.

The Excess Demands over Grants and Appropriations for the year 1974-75 were presented to the Sabha on the 74th March, 1980 and discussed and voted on the 11th March, 1980. There were in all 12 demands, totaling sum Rs. 40,88,37,136.

All the demands were deemed to have been read and moved together. No Member rose to speak and the demands were put together and carried.

(ii) The Haryana Appropriation Bill (No. 1), 1980.

The Haryana Appropriation Bill (No. 2), 1980 (Bill No. 14 HLA of 1980) in respect Excess Demands over Grants and Appropriations for the year 1974-75 voted by the House on 11th March, 1980, was introduced on the 20th March, 1980 (First Sitting). The Total sum to be authorised out of consolidated Fund of the State was Rs. 40,88,37,136.

Only one member from the Opposition Benches spoke for 1 minute.

It was remained before the House for five minutes.

Four Minutes were taken in putting the other motions.

The Bill was passed.

**SYNOPSIS OF BILL PASSED BY HARYANA VIDHAN SABHA
VIDHAN SABHA DURING THE BUDGET SESSION, 1977**

1. The Haryana Appropriations (No. 3) Bill, 1980 (Introduced on the 20th march, 1980 (First Sitting and passed on the 20th March, 1980 (First Sitting).

This Bill seeks to authorize payment and appropriations of certain sums and out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Haryana for the services of the financial year ending on the 31st day of march, 1981.

2. The Haryana Appropriations (No. 1) Bill, 1980 (Introduced on the 20th march, 1980 (First Sitting and passed on the 20th March, 1980 (First Sitting).

This Bill seeks to provide for the authorization of appropriation of moneys out of the Consolidated Fund of the State of Haryana to meet the amount spent on certain services for the financial year 1974-75 in excess of the amount authorized or granted for these services for that year.

3. The Haryana Appropriations (No. 2) Bill, 1980 (Introduced on the 20th march, 1980 (First Sitting and passed on the 20th March, 1980 (First Sitting).

This Bill seeks authorize payment and appropriation of certain further sums from the services of the financial year ending on the 31st March, 1980.

4. The Haryana Legislative Assembly (Allowances and Pension of Members) Amendment Bill, 1980[Introduced on the 11th March, 1980 and passed on the 20th March, 1980 (Second Sitting)].

This Bill seeks to make a new provisions that a members shall not be debarred from claiming halting allowance under section 5 (b) (ii) merely on the ground that the meeting was adjourned for want of quorum or cancelled for any reason whatsoever, if the member came to know of such adjournment/cancellation after arriving at the place of the meeting.

5. The Haryana Legislative Assembly (Allowances and Pension of Members) Second Amendment Bill, 1980. [Introduced on the 11th March, 1980 and passed on the 20th March, 1980 (Second Sitting)].

This Bill seeks to enhance the constituency allowance of the Members from rupees two hundred per mensem to rupees five hundred per mensem and also the telephone allowance from one hundred per mensem to three hundred per mensem with effect from 1st April, 1980.

6. The Haryana Legislative Assembly Speaker's and Medical facilities (Amendment) Bill, 1980[Introduced on the 11th March, 1980 and passed on the 20th March, 1980 (Second Sitting)].

This Bill seeks to amend the parent act in order to provide that the date of eligibility for the purposes of pension and medical facilities under the Parent Act shall be 1-11-66 instead of 14-3-72 to remove discrimination. A new provision for the limitations of the pension in certain cases has also to be inserted in the parent Act as to provide that pensions under this Act plus any other pensions from State/Central Government does not exceed the maximum pension admissible to a Class 1 Officer of the Haryana State.

7. The Haryana salaries and Allowances of Ministers Amendment) Bill, 1980[Introduced on the 11th March, 1980 and passed on the 20th March, 1980 (Second Sitting)].

This Bill seeks to enhance the salary of a Deputy Minister from rupees eight hundred to rupees one thousand per mensem with effect from 1-4-80.

8. The Punjab Prohibition of cow Slaughter (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1980[Introduced on the 11th March, 1980 and passed on the 20th March, 1980 (Second Sitting)].

This Bill seeks to replace the Punjab Prohibition of cow Slaughter (Haryana Amendment) Ordinance, 1979, with a view to amends the parent Act, so as to impose ban on the

transport of cows outside the State of Haryana to slaughter houses at places where there was no restriction of the cow slaughter.

9. The Punjab Courts (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1980[Introduced on the 11th March, 1980 and passed on the 20th March, 1980 (Second Sitting)].

This Bill seeks to make provisions in sections 20 and 212 (1) of Punjab Court Act, 1918, to make them in conformity as per laid down by the supreme Court i.e. the power to transfer a District Judge or Additional District Judge shall vest in the High Court without consultation of the Government.

10.The Haryana Municipal Amendment) Bill, 1980[Introduced on the 11th March, 1980 and passed on the 21st March, 1980].

The Bill seeks to replace the Haryana Municipal (Second Amendment) Ordinance, 1979, with a view to amend the Haryana Municipal Act, 1973, so as to extend the period of holdings elections to the Municipality of first and second class after 17-10-1979 and to provide the nominations of a woman to the committee in case no woman is elected .

11. The Punjab Gram Panchayat (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1980 [Introduced on the 11th March, 1980 and passed on the 21st March, 1980].

This Bill seeks to remedy certain administrative deficiencies noticed in the Gram Panchayat Act relating inter-alia to the securing of Panchayat records from ex-sarpanchess and panches; the regular convening of Gram Sabha general meetings; preparing of maps of abadi-dehby the Panchayat; the implementation of Panchayat resolutions for enforcing prohibition; and appeals by panches and Sarpanches against the removal.

12. The Punjab Agricultural Produce markets (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1980 [Introduced on the 11th March, 1980 and passed on the 21st March, 1980].

The Bill seeks to amend the provisions of the Punjab Agricultural Produce Markets Act, 1961, so that the Market Committees should be constituted by nomination by reviving the previous provisions of the Act. It has also been decided to give representations to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes and Backward classes in every market Committee.

13. The Punjab Co-operative Land Development Banks (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1980 [Introduced on the 21st March, 1980 and passed on the 21st March, 1980].

This Bill seeks to change the nomenclature of the Land Development Bank "Agricultural Development Bank"

This Bill further seeks to diversify the lending of money through these Banks to other purposes such as poultry, Piggery, Fisheries, Sheep-breeding, Be-keeping, and installation of Mil-Chilling/Gobar Gas Plants. It also provides for disposal of loan applications up to Rs. 5000/- to the small/marginal farmers, against the creation of charge on land or interest therein.

14. The Punjab Khadi and Village Industries Board (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1980 [Introduced on the 21st March, 1980 and passed on the 21st March, 1980].

This Bill seeks to empower the State Government to nominate the Vice-Chairman, as in the case of the Chairman, Secretary and Joint secretary of the Board. In the Case of absence of the Chairman State Government has been vested the power to nominate Vice-Chairman to Act i place of the Chairman.

15. The Haryana Legislative Assembly (Allowances and Pension of Members) Third Amendment Bill, 1980 [Introduced on the 21st March, 1980 and passed on the 21st March, 1980].

This Bill seeks to amend sub-section (1-A) of Section 7-A of the Haryana Legislative Assembly (Allowances and Pension of Members) 1975, for removing the restriction which made a member ineligible to earn pension even for the term during which he had incurred no disqualification. This Bill removes

the lacuna retrospectively. i.e. from 8th April, 1977 the date from which section 7-A became operative.

16. The Haryana Legislative Assembly (Facilities to Members) Amendment Bill, 1980 [Introduced on the 21st March, 1980 and passed on the 21st March, 1980].

The Bill seeks to amend the parent Act in order to provide that the existing limit for the grant of re-payable advance to members be revised to rupees sixty thousand for building a house and to rupees thousand for the purchase of a car. The restriction that a member could take either a house building advance or an advance for the purchase motor car has been removed. The Speakers and the Deputy speaker have been made eligible to be advance for building a house in their capacity as members.

17. The Haryana Legislative Assembly Speaker's and Deputy speaker's Salaries and Allowances (Amendment) Bill, 1980 [Introduced on the 21st March, 1980 and passed on the 21st March, 1980].

This Bill seeks to enhance the existing limit of rupees thirty thousand for the grant of an advance to the Speaker and the Deputy speaker for the purchase of a motor car to rupees forty thousand. Further, the provisions under section 7 of the present Act has been omitted, so that the Speaker and Deputy speaker may also be entitled to an advance for building a

house under the Haryana Legislative Assembly (Facilities to Members) Act, 1979.

18. The Punjab Land Revenue (Haryana Amendment) Bill, 1980 [Introduced on the 11th March, 1980 and passed on the 20th March, 1980 (Second Sitting)].

This Bill seeks to amalgamate the Haryana Patwar Services Reconstruction Fund and the Special Fund for Reconstruction and Rehabilitation of Ex-Servicemen into a single Fund known as Haryana Amalgamated Fund for the welfare of Ex-Servicemen and to loan under the defunct Fund and the new Amalgamated Fund.

19. The Haryana Validation of Octroi and Surcharge Bill 1980 [Introduced on the 11th March, 1980 and passed on the 20th March, 1980 (Second Sitting)].

This Bill seeks to validate the imposition and collection of Octroi, and surcharge by the Municipal Committee, Yamuna nager.

NO-CONFIDENCE MOTION AGAINST THE SPEKER

1. On the 14th March, 1980, Sh. Mool Chand Jain and 29 other members from the Opposition gave notice of a No-Confidence motion against the Speaker.

2. As the motion was against the Speaker himself he considered it appropriate to refer it to the Deputy Speaker for taking a decision thereon and, as such he (Deputy Speaker) examined it thoroughly keeping in view the Constitutional and legal aspects thereof. Before announcing the final decision, the Deputy Speaker referred to the following provision of the Constitution of India:-

“179. Vacation and Resignation of, and removal from the officess of the Speaker..... A member holding office as Speaker..... of any Assembly.

(c) may be removed from his office by a resolution of the Assembly passed by a majority of all the then members of the Assembly:

Provided that no resolution for purposes of clause (c) shall be moved unless at least fourteen days, notice has been given of the intention to move the resolution...”

And ruled that the notice was short of that period. Hence, it could not be entertained. All the members of the Haryana Vidhan sabha were fully aware that the house the house was to ad-journ sine-die. On 19th or at the most 20th or 21st instant. If they had any idea of giving such a notice then they should have thought patiently and should have given 14

days notice before the programmers set for the session. in addition to it, the notice was defective legally also because they had given notice of s no-confidence motion against the speaker. All the members of the opposition were taking the matter very lightly and giving the notice of this sort and then withdrawing the same. They should not have taken it in such a light manner against such an august office. It had 2/3 defects. Hence it was disallowed.

SUSPENSION OF TWO MEMBERS FROM THE SERVICE OF THE HOUSE

On 19th March, 1980, Sh. Ganga Ram a Member of the Opposition, not being permitted to raise the matter concerning alleged manhandling and maltreatment of blind persons of Haryana by the Police at Chandigarh on 18-3-80, without proper notice, he had and Ch. Sant Kanwar, another Member of the opposition, staged at Dharnas for some time on the floor of the House (by squatting in the space between the speaker's podium and the front row) against the Government for not making a statement on the matter. On this the Local Government Minister, while rising on a point of order sought the ruling of the Speaker as to whether a Dharna by the Members during the sitting of the Assembly constituted a breach of privilege and a contempt of the House or not?

On the 21st March, 1980, the Speaker while giving his ruling observed that the obstructionist behaviour of the two members staging Dharna was most undesirable, reprehensible, against the well established parliamentary etiquettes and prima-facie constituted contempt of the House. Taking a lenient view and in order to deter such incidents

from recurring, he recommended the following two courses of the House, which is supreme, to decide-

(i) An apology to be tendered by both the members and an assurance of their future good behaviour be given by the leader of their party; and

(ii) the administering of a reprimand by the House.

He however, observed that the house was supreme and could take any decision it thought fit, but, in his opinion, either one of the two courses, suggested by him, would serve the purpose of ensuring decorum, discipline and meet, the ends of justice.

Upon refusal to tender apology by the said two Members, the motion moved by the Local Govt. Minister-

That Sarvshri Ganga Ram and Sant Kanwar , m>L>A., committed a contempt of the House on 19-3-1980 by staging a dharna in front of the dias of the Hon. Speakers which impeded the smooth working of the House.

Now, therefore, I beg to move that both the above said M.L.A.s i.e. Sarvshri Ganga Ram and Sant Kanwar be reprimanded for their mis-conduct.

Was, after some discussion, put and carried. Thereafter, the Speaker asked Sarvshri Ganga Ram and sant Kanwar to rise in their seats to receive the punishment of reprimand in accordance with the decision of the House and on their not doing so, on a motion moved by the Local Govt. Minister and carried, they were suspended for rest of the session and directed to absent themselves from the meetings

of this House for the remainder of the present session as by their conduct of not rising in their seats to receive the punishment of reprimand and defying the orders of the House, they had committed gross contempt of the House and breach of privilege.

It was held that it could be done.

4. Whether the staging of dharna in the House while in session constituted a breach of privilege and contempt of the House or not?

It was held that the obstructionist behavior of the Members staging dharna was not desirable, reprehensible, against the well-established, Parliamentary etiquettes and prima-facie constituted contempt of the House.

Whether the discretionary power of the Speaker to expunge part or parts of the proceedings extends beyond the term and words “defamatory, or indecent, or unparliamentarily or undignified” under rule 116 of the Rules of Procedure and whether the Speaker could order the expunction of his own ruling or observation given on the floors of the House?

RULING GIVEN BY THE SPEAKER

1. Ruling given by the Speaker (Col Rao Ram Singh) on the 5th March, 1980, regarding mentioning by the present Government (Governor) of the achievements of the previous Govt., of which they were the members, in the Governor's Address.

Hon. Members, as you are aware, Sh. Kanwal Sing, M.L.A. raised a point of order on the 4th March, 1980; to the effect whether the present Government (Governor) could mention the achievements of the previous Government, of which they were members, in the Governor's Address. I have examined this point in details.

The Governor's Address contains a review of the activities and achievements of the Govt. during the previous years and its policy with regard to important problems as also the legislative proposals and financial recommendations. According to Article 163(1) of the Constitution, 'there shall be council of minister with the Chief Minister at the head to aid and advise the Governor in the exercise of his functions, except in so far as he is by or under this constitution required to exercise his functions or any of them in his discretion;

The Government is a permanent body and has a perpetual succession and Governor being the head of executive (Govt.) an rightly mention the activities and achievements made by his Govt. during the year the previous irrespective of

the fact whether his council of ministers was headed by one person or the other.

2. Ruling given by the Speaker (Col Rao Ram Singh) on the 11th March, 1980, on the point of order raised on the 7th March, 1980, regarding discretionary power of the Speaker to expunge part or parts of the proceedings under rule 116 of the Assembly Rules etc.

Hon. Members, a couple of points of order were raised two or three days back. जिन पर मैंने अपनी रूलिंग रिजर्व की थी उन पर रूज स्टडी करने के पचात् अब मैं रूलिंग देता हूँ।

The first point is “Does the Speaker’s discretion extend beyond the term and words ‘defamatory or indecent, or un-parliamentary or undignified’ under Rule 116 of the Rules of Procedure and conduct of Business in the Haryana Vidhan Sabha, in power of the Speaker to expunge part or parts of the proceedings?”

ordered, in his discretion, from time to time, the expunction of words, which he considered sub-judice, prejudicial to the national interest, or the maintenance of friendly relations with a foreign State, derogatory to high dignitaries likely to offend national sentiments or the religious susceptibilities of a community, likely to discredit the Indian Army, and not in good taste or otherwise objectionable. Further, the chair can order expunction of words /remarks/speech and even order their not being recorded in any of the following cases:-

(i) When a member, on being asked to withdraw objectionable remarks held to be not relevant to the debate, refuses to do so;

(ii) On being asked by the chair not to quote from a document of which advance notice has not been given and which is not relevant to the debate, if the member continues to quote there from:

(iii) where a member without being called upon to speak, continues speaking despite the chair asking him to desist from it;

(iv) if a member continues to interrupt the speech of another member or minister; and

(v) if a member speaks on an extraneous matter without rising on a point of order.

The Second point “ Can the Speaker order expunction of his own ruling or observation given on the floor of the House ?” As regards this point, when a speaker gives a ruling on any point of order or otherwise arising during the

course of debate, it becomes the order of the House. The ruling of the Speaker is final. Although the ruling of the Speaker is never expunged, however, there is nothing to prevent the Speaker from revising any ruling at any subsequent stage if the changed circumstances so warrant.

Hon. Member, it will be observed that one of the important criteria for expunction is that of a member containing to interrupt the speeches of another member or a minister or even in the case of the chief minister. The same will apply to irrelevant points of order. I have been noticing in this House that for the past few days, the members have been raising irrelevant points of order merely to interrupt the continuity of the speech of some of the senior legislators and even some of the ministers. No doubt, there can be no hard and fast rules or yardstick to determine before-hand whether a point of order is relevant or irrelevant but as you might be aware of old story of 'wolf, wolf' is repeated, the people are bound experience, I was constrained to observe that there was no point of order as numerous irrelevant points of order were being raised primarily with a view to interrupt the speeches of the Members, Ministers and even the chief Minister. It will also be appreciated that a point of order can be raised only in respect of the subject before the House. So when there was no occasion or to subject did not attract any point of order, it was not very difficult for me even to pre-judice that the sole objective of the point of order was to interrupt the continuity of speech of the Members and it was not actually a point of order.

Hon. Member, we all are here to serve our masters, which is the electorate. I owe it to the House that the discussions are not interrupted on trivial and irrelevant grounds. This I wish to ensure to the best of my ability. I am open to suggestion from the senior legislators and even from some other friends to ensure the achievements of this object. I would conclude my ruling with an appeal to at least the Leaders of all the parties and various groups in this House that they should ensure that our deliberations are not disturbed or interrupted on trivial and irrelevant grounds. Towards this object they should ensure that the members of their parties or groups remain within the ambit of some semblance of decorum and disciplines, which has been sadly lacking in this House in the past one week.

“179. Vacation and Resignation of, and removal from the offices of the Speaker..... A member holding office as Speaker..... of any assembly.

(c) may be removed from his office by a resolution of the Assembly passed by a majority of all the then members of the Assembly:

Provided that no resolution for purposes of clause (c) shall be moved unless at least fourteen days, notice has been given of the intention to move the resolution...”

This notice is short of that period. Hence, it could not be entertained. All the members of the Haryana Vidhan Sabha were fully aware that the house was to adjourn sine-die. On 19th or at the most 20th and 21st instant. If they had any idea of giving such a notice then they should have thought patiently and should have given 14 days notice before the programme set for the session. In addition to it, the notice was defective legally also because they had given notice of a no-confidence motion against the speaker. All the members of the opposition were taking the matter very lightly and giving the notice of this sort and then withdrawing the same. They should not have taken it in such a light manner against such an august office. It had 2/3 defects. Hence it was disallowed.

4. Ruling given by the Speaker (Col Rao Ram Singh) on the 21st March, 1980, on the point of order raised on the

19-3-80 regarding staging of dharna on the floor of the House while in session.

On the 19th of March, 1980, the Hon. Minister of Parliamentary Affairs raised a point of order requesting for my ruling on the question as to whether a dharna by the members during the sitting of the Assembly constituted a breach of privilege and a contempt of the House or not.

Before I give my Ruling it would not be out of place to recapitulate the incident leading to these events. Immediately after the question Hour on the 19th March, 1980, Sh. Ganga Ram, M.L.A., raised a point of order by stating these words. 'मुख्य मंत्री क्योंकि जवाब नहीं दे रहे हैं इसलिये मैं कुछ कहना चाहता हूँ' - I Over ruled this point of order as no point of orders was involved. He persisted in interrupting the proceedings. In spite of numerous directions by me to resume his seat, he defied the Chair and continued to cause interruptions. Not only this, thereafter Sarvshri Ganga Ram and Sant Kanwar, M.L.A., staged a dharna by squatting in the space between the Speaker's podium and the front row thereby further obstructing the proceedings. Subsequently, they were persuaded by other members of their party in resuming their seats.

I have examined this matter in great detail and also some precedents of a similar nature. There is no doubt that the obstructionist behaviour of the two members was not undesirable, reprehensible, against the well established parliamentary etiquettes and prima facie constitutes contempt of the House. In order to maintain the highest traditions of

this august House, the members are expected to observe a high standard of conduct. Their behaviour should be such as to enhance the dignity of the House and of its members. Having examined previous cases of this nature, I find that there are no clear cut rules or breach of privilege. In all previous cases, the Speaker's exercised their discretion depending upon the seriousness of the incident. As I already said no doubt this incident was of a highly reprehensible nature and of extreme gravity, but, gentlemen, today being the last day of the session, I am of the opinion that a spirit of "peace on earth and goodwill towards fellowmen" should prevail. This makes me lean towards adopting an attitude of leniency and, therefore, I rule out the possibility of a breach of privilege being brought in against the members. However, in order to deter such incidents from recurring, I would recommend the following two courses of the House, which is supreme, to decide-

(i) An apology to be tendered by both the members and an assurance of their future good behaviour be given by the leader of their party; and

(ii) the administering of a reprimand by the House.

He however, observed that the house was supreme and could take any decision it thought fit, but, in his opinion, either one of the two courses, suggested by him, would serve the purpose of ensuring decorum, discipline and meet, the ends of justice.

5. Ruling given by the Speaker (Col Rao Ram Singh) on the 15th March, 1980, regarding reconsideration of the ruling given by the Deputy Speaker concerning the no-confidence motion against the Speaker.

जो चेयर की तरफ से रूलिंग आ चुकी है उस पर कोई बहस नहीं होगी।

At page 101 of the book 'Practice and procedure of Parliament by Kaul and Shakhder' it is stated-

“ The Deputy speaker has the same power as the Speaker when presiding over a sitting of the House and all references to the Speaker in the Rules are deemed to be references to the Deputy Speaker when he so presides. It has been consistently held that no appeal lies to the Speaker against a ruling given by the Deputy Speaker or any other person presiding over a sitting of the House in the absence of the speaker..”

The Ruling given by the Deputy Speaker is final and there will be no discussions on the ruling given by the chair.

There can be no reconsideration of the ruling given by the chair.

A definite proposal was made that the Ruling given by the Deputy Speaker should be reconsidered and I have over-ruled it.

I have already told you that the ruling by the Deputy Speaker is the ruling of the Chair and there is no question of raising any point or discussion on that ruling.

Further, the chair can order expunction of words /remarks/speech and even order their not being recorded in any of the following cases:-

(i) When a member, on being asked to withdraw objectionable remarks held to be not relevant to the debate, refuses to do so;

(ii) On being asked by the chair not to quote from a document of which advance notice has not been given and which is not relevant to the debate, if the member continues to quote there from:

(iii) where a member without being called upon to speak, continues speaking despite the chair asking him to desist from it;

(iv) if a member continues to interrupt the speech of another member or minister; and

(v) if a member speaks or an extraneous matter without rising on a point of order.

The Second points “ Can the Speaker order expunction of his own ruling or observation given on the floor of the House ?” As regards this point, when a speaker gives a ruling on any point of order or otherwise arising during the course of debate, it becomes the order of the House. The ruling of the Speaker is final. Although the ruling of the Speaker is never expunged, however, there is nothing to prevent the Speaker from revising any ruling at any subsequent stage if the changed circumstances so warrant.

Hon. Member, it will be observed that one of the important criteria for expunction is that of a member containing to interrupt the speeches of another member or a minister or even in the case of the chief minister. The same will apply to irrelevant points of order. I have been noticing in this House that for the past few days, the members have been raising irrelevant points of order merely to interrupt the continuity of the speech of some of the senior legislators and even some of the ministers. No doubt, there can be no hard and fast rules or yardstick to determine before-hand whether a point of order is relevant or irrelevant but as you might be aware of old story of ‘wolf, wolf’ is repeated, the people are bound experience, I was constrained to observe that there was no point of order as numerous irrelevant points of order were being raised primarily with a view to interrupt the speeches of the Members, Ministers and even the chief Minister. It will also be appreciated that a point of order can be raised only in respect of the subject before the House. So when there was no

occasion or to subject did not attract any point of order, it was not very difficult for me even to pre-judice that the sole objective of the point of order was to interrupt the continuity of speech of the Members and it was not actually a point of order.

Hon. Member, we all are here to serve our masters, which is the electorate. I owe it to the House that the discussions are not interrupted on trivial and irrelevant grounds. This I wish to ensure to the best of my ability. I am open to suggestion from the senior legislators and even from some other friends to ensure the achievements of this object. I would conclude my ruling with an appeal to at least the Leaders of all the parties and various groups in this House that they should ensure that our deliberations are not disturbed or interrupted on trivial and irrelevant grounds. Towards this object they should ensure that the members of their parties or groups remain within the ambit of some semblance of decorum and disciplines, which has been sadly lacking in this House in the past one week.

II. Ruling of the Speaker on the point of order raised by the Local Govt. Minister on 19.3.1980

on the 19-3-80 regarding staging of dharna by the members during the sitting of the Assembly constituted a breach of privilege and a contempt of the House or not.

Before I give my Ruling it would not be out of place to recapitulate the incident leading to these events. Immediately after the question Hour on the 19th March, 1980, Sh. Ganga Ram, M.L.A., raised a point of order by stating these words 'मुख्य मंत्री क्योंकि जवाब नहीं दे रहे हैं इसलिए मैं

कुछ कहना चाहता हूँ' — I Over ruled this point of order as no point of orders was involved. He persisted in interrupting the proceedings. In spite of numerous directions by me to resume his seat, he defied the Chair and continued to cause interruptions. Not only this, thereafter Sarvshri Ganga Ram and Sant Kanwar, M.L.A., staged a dharna by squatting in the space between the Speaker's podium and the front row thereby further obstructing the proceedings. Subsequently, they were persuaded by other members of their party in resuming their seats.

I have examined this matter in great detail and also some precedents of a similar nature. There is no doubt that the obstructionist behaviour of the two members was not undesirable, reprehensible, against the well established parliamentary etiquettes and prima facie constitutes contempt of the House. In order to maintain the highest traditions of this august House, the members are expected to observe a high standard of conduct. Their behaviour should be such as to enhance the dignity of the House and of its members. Having examined previous cases of this nature, I find that there are no clear cut rules or breach of privilege. In all previous cases, the Speaker's exercised their discretion depending upon the seriousness of the incident. As I already said no doubt this incident was of a highly reprehensible nature and of extreme gravity, but, gentlemen, today being the last day of the session, I am of the opinion that a spirit of "peace on earth and goodwill towards fellowmen" should prevail. This makes me lean towards adopting an attitude of leniency and, therefore, I rule out the possibility of a breach of privilege being brought in against the members. However, in order to

deter such incidents from recurring, I would recommend the following two courses of the House, which is supreme, to decide-

(i) An apology to be tendered by both the members and an assurance of their future good behaviour be given by the leader of their party; and

(ii) the administering of a reprimand by the House.

Hon. Member, as I have already said, the House is supreme and can take any decision it thinks fit, but, in my opinion, either one of these two courses suggested by me, will serve the purpose of ensuring decorum, discipline and meet the ends of justice.

Sarvshri K.L. Poswal and Birinder Singh, members from the Treasury Benches and Sarvshri Mool Chand Jain, Mangal Sein, Har Swarup Bura, Ganga Ram and Sant Kanwar, member from the Opposition Benches, while expressing their views in the matter spoke for 1, 2, 2, 2, 1, 2 & 2 minutes, respectively.

The Local Government Minister and the Chief Minister also spoke for 3 and 2 minutes, respectively.

Upon refusal to tender apology by the two Members, the Local Government Minister moved:-

That Sarvshri Ganga Ram and Sant Kanwar, M.L.As, committed a contempt of the House on 19.3.1980 by staging a dharna in front of the dais of the Hon. Speaker which impeded the smooth working to the House.

Now, therefore, I beg to move that both the above said M.L.As. i.e. Sarvshri Ganga Ram and Sant Kanwar b reprimanded for their mis-conduct.

Ch. Rizaq Ram, a member from the Treasury Benches, and Sh. Kanwal Singh, Sm.t Sushma Swaraj and Sarvshri Baldev Tayal, Sant Kanwar and Ganga Ram, members from the Opposition Benches, spoke for 1, 2, 2, 3, 2 and 3 minutes, respectively.

The Local Government Minister also spoke for 2 minutes.

Walk-out

Sh. Baldev Tayal, a member of the opposition, staged a walk-out as a protest for not taking a lenient view in the matter of staging a dharna by Sarvshir Ganga Ram and Sant Kanwar in the House on 19.3.1980.

The motion moved by the Local Government Minister was put to the vote of the House.

After ascertaining the votes of the members by voices, Mr. Speaker announced that "The Ayes have it". This opinion was challenged and division was claimed. Mr. Speaker after (considering that the division was unnecessarily claimed) calling upon those members who were for "Aye" and those who were for "No", respectively, to rise in their places and on a count having been taken, declared that the motion was carried.

The motion was carried.

Thereafter, Dr. Mangal Sein rising on a point of order claimed division by going into the respective lobbies. The Speaker observed that on counting having been done, the motion had been declared carried and there was no question of challenging that. Besides, he felt that the division was unnecessarily claimed. He, therefore, ruled the point out of order for division by going into the lobbies under rule 94(4) of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the Haryana Legislative Assembly.

The Speaker asked Sarvshri Ganga Ram and Sant Kanwar to rise in their seats to receive the punishment of reprimand in accordance with the decision of the House.

Walk-out

The member of the Janata and the Lok Dal parties, including Sarvshri Ganga Ram and Sant Kanwar, staged a walk-out against the decision of the House to reprimand Sarvshri Ganga Ram and Sant Kanwar.

III. Suspension of Rule 104 and suspension of Sarvshri Ganga Ram and Sant Kanwar.

The Local Government Minister moved:-

That Rule 104 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the House be suspended in its application to the motion regarding the suspension of Sarvshri Ganga Ram and Sant Kanwar.

The Chief Parliamentary Secretary seconded the motion.

The motion was put and carried.

The Local Government Minister moved:-

That on 21.3.1980, two members of this House, namely, Sarvshri Ganga Ram and Sant Kanwar having been asked by the Hon. Speaker to rise in their seats did not rise in their seats to receive the punishment of reprimand and defied the order of the House. By this conduct of theirs they committed gross contempt of the House and breach of privilege. This House suspends them for the rest of the session and directs the aforesaid members to absent themselves from the meetings of this House for the remainder of the present session.

The Chief Parliamentary Secretary seconded the motion.

The motion was put and carried.

IV. Withdrawal of notice of breach of Privilege.

The Speaker informed Sh. Shamsheer Singh, M.L.A., that Sh. P.C. Wadhwa, Inspector General of Police, had sent in his apologies in connection with the notice of breach of privilege given by him on 20.3.1980 against the I.G. Police. He, therefore, withdrew his notice.

V. Call Attention Motion.

The Speaker admitted Calling Attention No. 25 given notice by Sarvshri Hukan Singh, Hira Nand Arya and Ran Singh Mann, M.L.As regarding closing of the Dalmia Cement Factory, Charkhi Dadri and asked the Minister concerned to make a statment.

The Chief Minister stated that written reply would be sent within four days.

VI. Suspension of sitting.

At 10.50 A.M. the Speaker, on finding that Sarvshri Ganga Ram and Sant Kanwar, who had been suspended for the rest of session, had entered into the House, asked them repeatedly to withdraw from the House but they did not do so and even resisted the Serjeant-at-Arms for removing them from the House and finding grave disorder in the House, suspended the sitting for half-an-hour.

The House re-assembled at 11.20 a.m.

VII. Call Attention Motion

The Speaker admitted Calling Attention No. 28 given notice of by Ch. Har Swarup Bura, M.L.A. regarding shortage of fodder in the State but, as the Hon. Member, when called upon, did not read out his motion, the same was disallowed.

VIII. Statements by Ministers.

(i) The Transport Minister made a statement on Calling Attention No. 21 given notice of by Sh. Hira Nand Arya, which was admitted on the 20th March, 1980 (First

sitting) regarding providing of special facilities in employment and education to blind persons.

(ii) The Chief Minister made a statement on Calling Attention No. 24 given notice of by Ch. Rizaq Ram, which was admitted on the 20th March, 1980 (First sitting) regarding construction of Thein Dam on River Ravi.

Walk-out

The members of the Janata and Lok Dal parties, present in the House, staged a walk-out as a protest for not being given an opportunity to speak.

IX. Motion under Rule 15.

The Local Government Minister moved:-

That the proceedings on the items of business fixed for today be exempted at this day's sitting from the provisions of the Rule 'Sitting of the Assembly', indefinitely.

The motion was put and carried.

X. Presentation of Report.
